The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. Renewal of Type B Water Licence to support regular community water supply, wastewater treatment and discharge, and solid waste management.
 - a. Extension of operational phase from 20 August 2024 to 21 August 2044
2. Associated NPC File No.: 149071; Associated NIRB File No.: 08QN055; Associated NWB File No.: 3BM-CLY1924
3. Location: Qikiqtani Region; [Municipality of Clyde River]

A complete description of the project proposal reviewed by the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) can be accessed online using the link below.

The NPC has completed its review of the above-noted project proposal. The activities associated with this proposal were previously reviewed by NPC and a conformity determination was issued on 26 April 2019 which still applies. In addition, associated activities were previously screened by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB File No.: 08QN055). The project proposal is exempt from the *Nunavut Planning & Project Assessment Act* under Section 235 of that Act.

The above-noted project proposal does not require screening because it belongs to a class of exempt works or activities set out in Schedule 12-1 of the *Nunavut Agreement*, and the NPC does not have concerns regarding the cumulative impacts of the project proposal.

By way of this letter, the NPC is forwarding the project proposal to the regulatory authorities identified by the proponent. This conformity determination applies only to the above noted project proposal as submitted.
