On November 21, 2016 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) received a referral to screen TMAC Resources' "Scientific Research" project proposal. The NIRB has a new online public registry system and as a result project proponents should now directly submit their project proposal information to the NIRB using the online application form, directly uploading associated management plans, GIS files, etc. rather than relying on email or regular mail. The new registry can be accessed at www.nirb.ca, register an account through the link found in the upper right hand corner of the webpage.

The NIRB's new online public registry system allows for greatly improved functionality and access, including:

- All NIRB assessments and public registry documentation are now fully searchable by project or document type, project location, assessment status, or by keyword. You can also search the registry using an online map tool to find assessments within your area of interest!
- A new calendar feature makes it easier than ever to track public commenting opportunities, community meetings and other events held by the NIRB
- Project proponents can now submit project proposals and supporting information directly to the NIRB via an online form.
- All project assessments have a unique individual page called a Project Dashboard, with all documentation more accessible than ever before.
- New digitized comment forms allow interested parties to submit comments directly to the NIRB regarding any assessment of interest.
- Access all information anonymously or register an account to follow NIRB assessments and receive all updates and alerts as they are issued.
- Increased content and access in Inuktitut, Inuinnaqtun and English!

When completing your online application please attach the completed NIRB Part 1 Forms in Inuktitut and Inuinnaqtun and a map. The NIRB Part 1 Form in English is provided as information only.
