2012 Planned Work:

In 2011, Commander Resources secured a joint venture on the Storm Property with Aston Bay Ventures who will be overseeing future work programs. The 2012 work program will comprise ground staking mineral claims, review of existing core stored at the Aston Bay airstrip, completing a GPS survey of previous drill hole locations and limited prospecting.

Fixed-wing aircraft will transport personnel and supplies to the Aston Bay airstrip on an as need basis. A helicopter based at Resolute Bay will be used on a daily basis for crew setouts and pickups.

All work will be conducted in accordance with the Commander Resources Ltd. operational plans as outlined in the company's Health & Safety Manual, Fuel Spill Contingency Plan and Final Abandonment and Restoration Plan.

Wildlife:

Wildlife sightings very limited during the 2011 field program. One muskox reported but no further details are available.
