Re: Agnico Eagle's Response to NIRB's 2024-2025 Annual Monitoring Report and Board Recommendations for the Hope Bay Mine

Dear Mr. Morrison

Agnico Eagle thanks the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) for the recommendations and comments included in the NIRB's *2024-2025 Annual Monitoring Report for the Doris North Gold Mine and Phase 2 Hope Bay Belt Projects and Board's Recommendations* (the Recommendations Report) received November 26, 2025.

Within the Recommendation Report, two recommendations were made for Hope Bay, which we understand to be consistent among proponents in Nunavut. The following recommendations were made:

Recommendation 1: Agnico Eagle shall provide an update within 30 days of receiving the NIRB Monitoring Officers' 2025 Report, on the development of a publicly-accessible Project-specific web portal or web page to make available in a central location all significant non-confidential monitoring and reporting information submitted to Regulatory Authorities pursuant to the Project Certificate and other territorial or federal permits issued for the Project.

Recommendation 2: Agnico Eagle shall have a publicly-accessible Project-specific web portal or web page to make available in a central location all significant non-confidential monitoring and reporting information submitted to Regulatory Authorities pursuant to the Project Certificate and other territorial or federal permits issued for the Project in place for the 2026-2027 reporting year.

In response to the recommendations:

Agnico Eagle thanks the Board for its recommendation and confirms that the Hope Bay Mine public reporting information is available on our active website: [Hope Bay Documents](#). This website echoes what has been submitted via the NIRB Public Registry in providing previous annual reports, current management plans, as well as other information pertaining to licenses and approvals.

Agnico Eagle acknowledges there are opportunities for improvement and will work towards making enhancements to the existing public registry that could provide additional ease for the public in finding files (e.g., categorizing site by environmental component; wildlife) over the coming years.

Further, Agnico Eagle remains open to discussing potential improvements to the existing website and would like to work alongside the Board to ensure that this recommendation is being fulfilled.
