Meeting Notes

Meeting began at 7:15pm

- Where is Goose Lake? I want to make sure we are talking about the right Goose Lake.
- Why is the company selling?
 - Reason 1 - Good project for someone to buy. High grade gold.
 - Reason 2 - Project is located in a safe jurisdiction for mining development.
 - Reason 3 - Bigger company helps reduce the risk of completing construction.
- Who is B2Gold?
 - B2Gold is Canadian owned company based out of Vancouver. They currently do not have any Canadian projects; however, they have international projects. B2Gold has, I believe, three mines that are producing. They are in Mali, Philippines and Namibia.
- How much gold will be mined over the life of the mine?
 - I will follow-up with John K. to ensure you get the right figure provided to you.
- What is the length of the life of the mine?

- 15 years, but once we start mining it is possible that there are more resources than anticipated which could extend the Project's life.
- I noticed there are a lot of Bay Chimo and Bathurst people here. What are your thoughts on the environmental impacts?
- My main concern is the tailings, and what comes down the river once production starts.
 - Water management across the Project is 100% Sabina's responsibility to manage. For example, all 'contact' water is captured, treated and monitored. The water is only released once it's been treated and it is declared safe to be released. All underground tailings water is placed in holding tanks then moved to tailings storage areas.
 - We are not building a separate tailings storage as of today, though we are permitted to build one. We plan to use exhausted mined pits for tailings storage.
- You talk about the skilled Inuit labour force - Can you define that for me? One of the risks in the Project presentation says, 'the lack of or limited skilled labour'.
 - That risk is for "skilled labour" as noted on the slide. Not specific to Inuit.
 - The difficulty of finding skilled labour to work at the Project. For example, we put a job advertisement out for Heavy Equipment Technicians. We reached out across the country, but we have minimal people willing to relocate to a remote mine and apply for the positions from time to time.
 - This is a problem across industries and across Canada.
- Are you taking on apprenticeships for the region?
 - We don't have a formal program at this time, but we are starting the process to take on apprentices. We have to be very careful to ensure when it is rolled out in order to ensure that it is effective and meets requirements. We actually have a meeting with the GN Department of Family Services in a few weeks to get this off the ground.
- At former mines, it was a couple of years before shutting down that the employees were approached for higher position opportunities. What will Sabina do to ensure that apprenticeship and higher skilled opportunities happen much quicker for Inuit?
 - We do not want to do that; we want to start early on career development plans and apprenticeship opportunities. It is Sabina's intention to provide every Inuit employee with a Career Development Plan if they want one over the next 18-24 months.
 - John K. has already been working on speaking to Inuit employees about their goals and aspirations during his monthly site visits.
- It is just as important to go to the high schools and colleges to speak about the potential for employment. But not everyone is cut out for mining; the rotations can be hinderance. For

example, 4 weeks on / 2 weeks off puts too much strain on relationships. Within the rotation system, are you looking at having people that can work one-on-one with the workers, to see if they are coping with the workplace? Is Sabina with the new takeover considering that type of approach?

- That's a role that John Kaiyogana plays for the Company at this time. John will reach out to each and every Inuk employee to ask how the employee is doing over the course of the year. We also conducted an Inuit Personnel Survey for the first time in 2022. Survey results will come out in March.
- When talking to students, get someone who actually works in the mine to talk about their experience.
- What's your drug policy?
 - Currently we do not run any pre-screening, but employees are observed getting on the plane and off the plane. When incidents occur, there are screening requirements. We will never pre-screen Inuit applicants for marijuana. We have a zero tolerance for drugs on site.
- Would it be possible to start another [advisory] committee for Sabina? We lost 3 Elders in the last few years who worked with Sabina.
 - Yes, 100%, we are working with KIA on creating the Inuit Environment Advisory Committee, consisting of 7 Kitikmeot Inuit. We hope to have the committee finalized in the next couple of months. The members will be chosen by Sabina and KIA and will meet once a year to discuss the Project. Their feedback will be reported to the public through annual reports.
- What do you need from the communities for the [advisory] committee?
 - The IIBA sets out the process for selection. That is between Sabina and KIA. A short list is developed, but we have not spoken to those people so we won't share those names here as it would be inappropriate at this time.

AM: No, legally we cannot have anyone under the age of 18 at a mine site.

A.Kuliktana: The welding program with Red Fish, will it involve participants from Kugluktuk?

Would the Red Fish program offer red seal tickets during the program?

Is B2Gold considering building an office in Kugluktuk?



Is there a Safety Team at your project?

AM: At present the Redfish Program only has opportunities in Cambridge Bay. However, it is B2Gold's hope that we see success in that program and can work with the Society to expand the programming in the years ahead. Participants in the program receive a CWB certification upon completion. At the present time we rent an office from the Hamlet. We do not have plans to build a larger stand alone office in Kugluktuk presently. Yes, we have Safety team that was expanded in 2022, and I believe in 2023 it is a team of between 6-8.

N.McNemeny: Would you consider having a tour for regular community members?

AM: Great idea. Not something we thought of in the past. Perhaps something we can look at moving forward.

L.Taipana: My question is emphasising on training, specifically for your Inuit employees. We know that mines tend to hire Inuit for low level positions. Will you train your inuit employees or build their training through a training plan.

AM: Yes, we currently have a career development plan process for intrested B2Gold Inuit employees. I will provide a career development report next time I'm in town. I can say though we have already seen success with this program. Several Inuit have Plans in active implementation and are seeing their careers grow.

AM: Provided an overview of the IIBA Regional Wealth Creation Fund and discussed that a Long Term Care Facility previously proposed for Kugluktuk was at the top of the list to receive funding until the Project fell through. B2Gold is interested in working with the Hamet to try and get this on the table again.

R. Nivingalok: The hamlet will get back to B2Gold. Another opportunity they would also consider is a simulator training program in Kugluktuk.
