# 1. Introduction

---

This document describes the *Community Engagement Plan* (Plan) that B2Gold Back River Corp. (B2Gold Nunavut or the Company) will follow in the development and operation of the Back River Project (Project). This Plan, and other management plans, are intended to describe the ways in which B2Gold Nunavut will address or mitigate issues identified in the Project's Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS).

B2Gold Nunavut recognizes the importance of good stakeholder relations and has developed this Plan using available best practice guidance. B2Gold Nunavut is further committed to fostering sustainable development throughout all stages of its activities. We constantly strive to conduct our operations in a manner that balances the social, economic, cultural, and environmental needs of the communities in which we operate. We are likewise committed to the health, safety, and well-being of our workforce and the communities we work alongside. To achieve this commitment B2Gold Nunavut will make zero harm the primary goal in all our places of work, incorporate safety as a core value of our business, and integrate safety considerations into all that we do.

This Plan supports B2Gold Nunavut's commitments related to sustainable development, social responsibility, and health and safety, and is a component of its broader Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) management and reporting system. The Plan is a living document and will be regularly updated based on management reviews, community engagement feedback, incident investigations, regulatory changes, or other pertinent Project-related changes. The Plan will be revisited and updated or adapted on a semi-regular basis. As B2Gold Nunavut works to address impacts and enhance benefits identified over time, changes may be made to this Plan to better achieve desired outcomes. B2Gold Nunavut's adaptive management strategy enables engaged parties to instigate change where required and to employ the use of new data and best practices as they become available; for example, data and analysis generated by the monitoring program throughout the life of the Project. Community engagement will be ongoing and will be implemented by B2Gold Nunavut's community relations and management staff.

## 2. Scope and Objectives

---

B2Gold Nunavut is dedicated to working closely with Kitikmeot residents, communities, and stakeholders to help ensure the Project is built in a manner consistent with regional needs and aspirations. The Plan will apply from the time of approval of all required licences and permits to allow construction of the Project to begin. The temporal extent of the Plan will be the life of the Project itself, including its Construction, Operation, Reclamation and Closure, and Temporary Closure / Care and Maintenance phases.

The objective of this Plan is to fulfil the Project's public engagement commitments and maintain meaningful relationships with local communities and public stakeholders. For the purpose of this Plan, the term 'public' refers to the Kitikmeot Region communities of Cambridge Bay, Kugluktuk, Bathurst Inlet, Bay Chimo, Gjoa Haven, Taloyoak, and Kugaaruk, in addition to those communities in the Northwest Territories that may be affected by the Project.

The results of community engagement conducted to-date have informed the development of the Plan. For example, B2Gold Nunavut has presented its community engagement plans and methods to key stakeholder groups for comment since the early phases of Project development. The Company also continues to update stakeholders on its community engagement activities and outcomes, and welcomes ongoing feedback on this topic. B2Gold Nunavut may adjust its engagement methods where appropriate based on feedback received. Identified topics of interest, common community concerns, and suggestions from local individuals have been considered and integrated into this and other plans where possible. B2Gold Nunavut's community engagement and outreach activities to-date have included meetings with:

- Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA)
- The public
- Hunter and Trapper Organizations (HTOs)
- Hamlet Mayors, Councils, and staff
- Community Advisory Groups (CAGs) in Cambridge Bay and Kugluktuk (no longer operating, replaced by IEAC)
- Inuit Environmental Advisory Committee (IEAC)
- Kitikmeot Socio-Economic Monitoring Committee (KSEMC)
- Athabasca Denesuline Né Né Land Corporation
- Individuals involved in Traditional Knowledge (TK) and socio-economic studies conducted for the Project
- Project employees and contractors
- High school students
- Various other community organizations and stakeholders

Community engagement methods employed by B2Gold Nunavut are numerous and have included presenting Project-related information in public and stakeholder meetings, community newsletters, and during radio shows; the establishment of community relations offices in Cambridge Bay and

Kugluktuk; and the use of social media among other methods. Community engagement methods as defined by the Plan are further detailed in Section 5.1.

B2Gold Nunavut will continue to engage with the KIA, IEAC, Kitikmeot residents, communities, and stakeholders throughout the Project development process and will ensure the provision of timely Project updates and responses to feedback provided. Inuinnaqtun and Inuktitut interpretation/translation will be provided, and written materials provided in those languages where appropriate, throughout the consultation process to enable participation of all community members. This Plan details those efforts B2Gold Nunavut will make to communicate and engage with local residents, communities, and stakeholders throughout the life of the Project.

## 3. Applicable Guidance and Legislation

---

### 3.1 B2GOLD NUNAVUT OPERATING POLICIES AND PRACTICES

Per B2Gold's *Social Responsibility and Human Rights Policy*, the Company will create a positive and sustainable legacy by understanding and managing the social and economic impacts and opportunities resulting from its presence. B2Gold Nunavut will engage openly and respectfully with stakeholders to understand and respond to their perspectives throughout the mine life.

B2Gold Nunavut will seek to gain and maintain support for its presence by considering and responding to stakeholder perspectives when creating plans and carrying out activities that will affect them, including this *Community Engagement Plan*. For example, this Plan will continue to be shared for comment with relevant stakeholders including the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) and members of the Back River Socio-Economic Monitoring Working Group (SEMWG). As noted previously, various components of this Plan have already been informed by community perspectives and feedback shared with the Company. A Devolution Agreement was also reached in January 2024 between the Governments of Canada and Nunavut and Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. As this Agreement is implemented over time, this Plan may change to reflect that Agreement.

More broadly, B2Gold Nunavut will work with community and government stakeholders and support social and economic development, including through community investment, local employment, and local procurement. One important way community benefits from the Project can be delivered is by providing meaningful employment and economic development opportunities directly to Inuit and Inuit owned businesses, which this Plan aims to support through meaningful community engagement initiatives.

B2Gold also maintains a *Social Performance Management System* which outlines the Company's expectations and requirements for the delivery of socially responsible performance and the management of social risks across all B2Gold related business activities and departments. There are 12 Performance Standards which derive from B2Gold policy and are consistent with international best practice. The *Stakeholder Engagement Standard* establishes requirements for proactive, open, and respectful engagement with stakeholders with the goal of building trust-based relationships. By implementing this standard, stakeholder engagement at the Project will:

- Ensure stakeholder perspectives are considered when making decisions that might impact them.
- Be prioritized based on potential impacts to stakeholders and risks to the Company.
- Be conducted as a two-way dialogue that works towards building trust-based relationships.

The *Stakeholder Engagement Standard* contains requirements pertaining to process; stakeholder identification and analysis; stakeholder engagement planning and implementation; and records, monitoring, reporting, and review. These requirements are addressed, in significant part, through the mitigation and management elements contained in this Plan (see Section 5 for additional details). Other requirements of the *Stakeholder Engagement Standard* have been addressed through the Project's FEIS process and documentation, other relevant management plans, and existing monitoring and adaptive management processes at the Project.

There are additional linkages between this Plan and B2Gold's *Procedure for Management of Community Feedback*. This procedure describes the process for external stakeholders to provide

feedback to B2Gold related to actual or perceived impacts of its activities, its employees, and its contractors, and to ensure that received feedback is addressed and resolved in a timely and transparent manner by the Company. More specifically, this procedure outlines the steps for managing external stakeholders' feedback at an operational level, including registering, investigating, resolving, and remedying feedback. While a full description of this procedure is beyond the scope of this Plan, Project staff responsible for this Plan (see Section 4) will comply with its expectations.

This Plan also has linkages with B2Gold's *Community Grievance Management Standard*. However, this particular standard is more fully addressed through B2Gold Nunavut's *Stakeholder Grievance Mechanism*.

B2Gold Nunavut is further committed to following mining industry best practices in its public consultation and engagement activities and to following the Prospectors & Developers Association of Canada's (PDAC) (2021) basic principles for successful community engagement as follows:

- *Say what you do and do what you say* – Following through on promises and commitments is critical to building credibility and the foundations for trust; not following through can damage the company-community relationship.
- *Listen* – Don't make assumptions about what people think, need or feel. Let them tell you in their own words and at their own pace. Try to understand any underlying concerns, hopes, and desires they may have. One way to encourage people to share these underlying interests is by asking follow-up questions like "Why do you say that?"
- *Show that you have listened* – You can do this through your body language (looking people in the eyes if culturally appropriate, nodding, not looking at your watch or fidgeting during long comments or meetings) but also by summarizing the point the other person has made and asking if you understood correctly.
- *Engagement must be ongoing* – If you only meet with stakeholders when there is a problem or when you need something from them you will not establish a positive relationship.
- *Manage expectations about involvement* – Determine which stakeholders you simply want to inform, which stakeholders you want to give a greater say in decision-making, or whom you may look to for advice. Ensure that you are on the same page with these stakeholders about their expectations of involvement; if people expect to be involved in decision-making but you only inform them – no matter how well you inform them – the predictable result will be tension in your relationship.
- *The quality of company-community relationships can also be influenced in three more ways.*
  - Take, and be seen to take, responsibility for project impacts, be they environmental, social, health-related, and so on.
  - Distribute benefits (jobs, contracts, community projects) transparently so your efforts are perceived as fair.
  - Demonstrate respect for local stakeholders and their concerns.

B2Gold Nunavut will also maintain a community Donations Policy (Appendix A) focused on supporting initiatives pertaining to 'education and training' and 'community wellness and traditional lifestyles' in Kitikmeot communities, with an emphasis on women and youth. For example, B2Gold Nunavut may provide awards to support youth education and involvement in mining, support northern training initiatives, and help facilitate the retention of youth in northern communities. B2Gold Nunavut will additionally continue to support childcare in the communities through its Donations Policy and informal visits to assess potential areas of need. Also, B2Gold Nunavut employees will be encouraged

to support childcare through volunteering and participation on the associated non-profit boards responsible in each community for the delivery of childcare programming. Donation request forms will be made available at various locations in English, Inuktitut, and Inuinnaqtun. Further engagement of youth may be undertaken with the aim of matching community-based investment with local demand and the needs of the Project. Engagement activities are described further in Section 5.

In addition, B2Gold Nunavut is committed to acting as a steward of the environment and promoting sustainable development of communities in the Kitikmeot Region. To fulfill this responsibility, B2Gold Nunavut has established an Inuit Impact and Benefit Agreement (IIBA) with KIA and filed separate Socio-Economic Management Plans with NIRB, including the *Community Engagement Plan*, that commit the Company to providing benefits and communicating openly with employees, contractors, local stakeholders, governments, and the public on Project activities and environmental and social programs and performance.

While this *Community Engagement Plan* has been developed to be consistent with B2Gold Nunavut's various corporate standards, policies, management plans, and procedures, in the event of any discrepancy between them and this Plan, the former documents will take precedence.

### 3.2 GOVERNMENT LEGISLATION AND POLICY

There are several regulatory or governing bodies that have established requirements or guidance which pertain to mining projects in Nunavut. NIRB, Nunavut Water Board (NWB), the Government of Nunavut Department of Economic Development and Transportation (GN DEDT), and Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated (NTI) have each developed guidelines for community consultation and engagement, including:

- As part of their mandate, NIRB was established so that Inuit have an opportunity to be formally involved in impact assessment in Nunavut, typically through requiring mineral development proponents to consult with all potentially affected communities during the impact assessment process.
- NWB requires community involvement in the water licensing process for mining projects, through public comment and public hearing mechanisms.
- GN DEDT has developed the guide *Consulting with Communities in Nunavut: Guide to Community Consultation for the Mineral Exploration and Mining Sector* to help ensure that meaningful benefits from resource development flow to Nunavummiut. The guide provides a 'who's who' in communities and outlines various cultural differences of which southerners may not be aware.
- NTI's *Mining Policy* (NTI 1997) contains provisions related to community consultation and engagement. NTI requires that all stakeholders be given a meaningful opportunity to participate in mineral development decision-making, and that participatory processes be open, transparent, timely, and well-defined.

In addition, there are typically project-specific guidelines issued that detail community involvement and consultation needs for individual projects; for example, those developed by NIRB for resource development projects in the region. For the Back River Project, consultation and community engagement requirements were specified by the *Project Guidelines for the Preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement* (NIRB 2013). Public consultation requirements during the NIRB's process are also reviewed in NIRB's (2020) *Proponent's Guide*. B2Gold Nunavut further understands NIRB is developing updated guidance specific to community engagement and the Company anticipates integrating this guidance once finalized.

### 3.3 OTHER GUIDANCE

Other valuable guidance for engaging with Nunavut communities exists. For example, Inuit Tapiriit Kanatami and Nunavut Research Institute (ITK and NRI, 2007) provide information and advice on this topic, with an emphasis on conducting research. Community perceptions, advantages of community involvement, negotiating research relationships, determining levels of community involvement, initiating community contact, research licencing, and other useful information are reviewed. Suggested communication methods with Inuit communities are also identified and include:

- Local or regional radio shows
- Workshops, meetings, or focus groups
- Presentations in the community and/or schools
- Interactive multi-media
- Posters
- Brochures, newsletters, newspaper inserts
- Providing copies of research results and data, co-authored publications

The Kitikmeot Heritage Society and Polar Knowledge Canada (KHS and PKC, No Date) have produced additional guidance for working with Nunavut communities and the community of Cambridge Bay in particular. This includes 'be patient, open, and accepting', 'be social', and 'be respectful of Inuit knowledge structures and rights'. Direction on translation and transcription, payment and honoraria, working with Elders, and communicating and disseminating research results is also provided. Group and one-on-one meetings, local radio, workshops, the internet, and community posters are further highlighted as being useful for sharing information with communities. Five community-desired directions that research conducted in Cambridge Bay should take are provided.

Various international best practices for community engagement also exist (e.g. Arctic Council 2019; ICMM 2015) that B2Gold Nunavut endeavours to follow. As this is a constantly evolving field, B2Gold Nunavut continues to monitor it for new developments.

## 4. Roles and Responsibilities

---

The General Manager, Goose Site will maintain overall responsibility for the Plan. Day-to-day implementation of the Plan, as well as on-going performance evaluations, updates or revisions to it, will be the responsibility of the Director, Indigenous & Northern Affairs or similar positions, or other designated management personnel with the requisite skill set and experience. These positions are also responsible for implementing B2Gold's *Procedure for Management of Community Feedback* at the Project. For example, community feedback is to be managed in B2Gold's Social Information Management System (SIMS), including receipt, recording, investigation, resolution, appeal and closure, as well as relevant records such as communications, investigation records/evidence, etc. These positions may also delegate responsibility for specific components of this Plan or procedure to other personnel.

B2Gold Nunavut will maintain one or more office locations in the Kitikmeot Region, where community members can obtain Project-related information, apply for employment, and have other issues or concerns addressed. B2Gold Nunavut currently has an office in Cambridge Bay staffed by a Supervisor, Community Relations and an office in Kugluktuk staffed by a Senior Coordinator, Indigenous Affairs.

In the implementation of this Plan, the Director, Indigenous & Northern Affairs will also work in collaboration with the Director, Human Resources & Organizational Development and the Manager, Supply Chain and their staff (e.g. staff with Inuit training and employment responsibilities) to ensure efforts are coordinated as they apply to the Plan. Other supporting roles and responsibilities of staff will be identified during implementation based on needs.

B2Gold Nunavut is committed to regular engagement of NIRB, KIA, and Kitikmeot communities and seeking feedback on potential areas for improvement in the Plan over the life of the Project. In this regard, the role of these organizations, community stakeholders, and the public is important to support continual improvement and adaptive management.

## 5. Mitigation and Management

Plan activities include the following main elements, elaborated on in the sections below:

- Methods to promote community engagement
- Providing Project updates
- Incorporation of public feedback and community input
- Promotion of Inuit participation in employment and contracting opportunities
- Communication of research and monitoring results

### 5.1 METHODS TO PROMOTE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

#### 5.1.1 Community Engagement Methods

B2Gold Nunavut’s community engagement methods may include public meetings, stakeholder meetings, northern B2Gold Nunavut offices and staff, IEAC meetings, site visits, social media, a Project newsletter, other informational materials, radio shows, and trade show participation. These methods will be used to provide Project updates (Section 5.2), incorporate public feedback and community input (Section 5.3), promote Inuit participation in employment and contracting opportunities (Section 5.4), and to communicate research and monitoring results (Section 5.5). In addition, B2Gold Nunavut has developed a *Stakeholder Grievance Mechanism* (SGM) that describes how stakeholder grievances are addressed for the Project. B2Gold Nunavut’s community engagement methods are summarized in Table 5.1-1.

Table 5.1-1. Community Engagement Methods

Method	Description
Public Meetings	Public meetings are open to all members of a community. B2Gold Nunavut will provide Project information and updates, solicit feedback, and be available to answer the public’s questions. Public meetings will be interpreted into local dialects and minutes will be taken by B2Gold Nunavut. Seasonal residents of Bathurst Inlet and Omingmaktok will be engaged primarily in Cambridge Bay.
Stakeholder Meetings	Meetings with key community stakeholder groups (e.g. HTOs, Hamlets, Indigenous organizations) will be conducted to provide Project updates, discuss particular Project-related topics, and solicit feedback as appropriate. Meetings will be interpreted into local dialects and minutes will be taken by B2Gold Nunavut.
B2Gold Nunavut Offices / Supervisor, Community Relations/ Community Liaison Officers / Senior Coordinator, Indigenous Affairs	B2Gold Nunavut will maintain one or more office locations in the Kitikmeot Region where community members can obtain Project-related information, apply for employment, and have other issues or concerns addressed. These offices will be staffed by a Supervisor, Community Relations, one or more Community Liaison Officers (CLOs) and a Senior Coordinator, Indigenous Affairs. The CLOs will also make regular site visits to meet with Inuit personnel.
Inuit Environmental Advisory Committee (IEAC)	The purpose of the IEAC is to receive and consider Project information that relates to the environment and wildlife, provide advice to B2Gold Nunavut and KIA about potential environmental or wildlife impacts or concerns, and hear and attempt to resolve concerns from community members related to environmental and wildlife aspects of the Project.

Method	Description
Kitikmeot Socio-Economic Monitoring Committee (KSEMC)	The KSEMC is one of three regional socio-economic monitoring committees in Nunavut, organized by the GN. It creates a discussion forum and information sharing hub that supports impacted communities and interested stakeholders to take part in socio-economic monitoring efforts related to resource development. B2Gold Nunavut is actively involved in the KSEMC and regularly participates in its meetings.
Site Visits	Visits to the Project site will be provided to selected stakeholders. Site visit participants will be shown different Project areas, provided with relevant Project information, and introduced to different Project staff.
Social Media	B2Gold will continue to maintain a Company website that provides up-to-date information on the Project. Social media and email distribution lists will also continue to be utilized to share Project-related information.
Project Newsletter	B2Gold Nunavut may issue a semi-regular Project newsletter to share information and keep communities and other stakeholders informed of Project developments. This newsletter will be translated into local dialects and may be distributed through B2Gold Nunavut's social media outlets and at physical locations throughout the Kitikmeot Region.
Other Informational Materials	Other informational materials (e.g. handouts, posters, popular summaries, Company reports) will be made available to communities and stakeholder groups as appropriate in order to widely share Project-related information. These will be translated into local dialects where appropriate. Intranet may also be used to share information with Project personnel.
Radio Shows	Radio shows provide a way to share Project information with a wide audience. Radio shows can be of a call-in nature where B2Gold Nunavut answers the public's questions, or of an informational nature where only Project updates are provided.
Trade Show Participation	Trade show participation (e.g. display booths, presentations, sponsorships) provides a way to share Project-related information and interact with the public.
Inuit Personnel Surveys	Surveys will collect employment, education, housing, and other information from Inuit Project personnel (i.e. employees and contractors). B2Gold Nunavut has been asked to collect some of this information under the Terms and Conditions of its Project Certificate issued by NIRB. This information will be used for socio-economic monitoring and management of the Project, and will provide feedback to B2Gold Nunavut on matters affecting its workforce.
Stakeholder Grievance Mechanism (SGM)	Describes how B2Gold Nunavut addresses stakeholder grievances for the Project. The SGM serves as a tool to strengthen stakeholder trust and support for the Project, and helps to identify actual and potential impacts B2Gold Nunavut needs to address through corrective actions.

Community engagement will prioritize the residents of those communities located nearest to the Project site, specifically residents of Cambridge Bay, Kugluktuk, Bathurst Inlet, and Omingmaktok. Meetings will take place and informational materials will be available in Cambridge Bay and Kugluktuk. Secondly, B2Gold Nunavut will also engage residents of the eastern Kitikmeot Region (Taloyoak, Gjoa Haven, and Kugaaruk) using similar methods.

To further support its engagement program, B2Gold Nunavut will maintain an internal calendar of important community events in the Kitikmeot Region. This calendar will be regularly updated and include dates and information on planned local events (e.g. trade shows, career fairs), meetings (e.g. KIA board meetings and annual general meeting, topic-specific workshops, KSEMC meetings), and festivities (e.g. spring frolics, fishing derbies, holiday celebrations). B2Gold Nunavut will continue to assess opportunities for enhanced engagement and support (e.g. sponsorships, donations) where appropriate.

B2Gold Nunavut will also generate awareness of its *Community Engagement Plan* among stakeholders in an ongoing manner, describe how community feedback can be provided to the Company, and explain how feedback will be (or has been) addressed. The Company will also regularly

assess stakeholder awareness of its feedback mechanisms (e.g. Are communities aware of them? How well are they understood?) and perceptions of their effectiveness (e.g. How well are they working?).

Through the methods and activities listed above, stakeholder-related risks and issues will be identified, assessed, and managed by B2Gold Nunavut in an ongoing manner.

### 5.1.2 Community Engagement Activities by Project Phase

Community engagement activities will be tailored according to individual Project phases. These include the Construction, Operations, Reclamation and Closure, Post-Closure, and Temporary Closure and Care and Maintenance phases. A summary of these activities is provided below, while a more detailed 4-year engagement plan (to be updated annually) is included in Appendix B.

Community engagement activities during the Construction phase of the Project will generally focus on:

- Providing communities with updates on Project and construction-related matters and dynamic developments.
- Informing communities of training, hiring, and business opportunities during construction and operations.
- Identifying community issues and concerns regarding construction-related activities.
- Continuing discussions on the development of Project monitoring programs.
- Providing information on future Project development plans.

B2Gold Nunavut will actively engage communities during the Construction phase of the Project. Construction will be a time of increased activity at the Project site, with an influx of large numbers of construction personnel, new machinery, and infrastructure and building materials. The Project will evolve rapidly and dynamically during the Construction phase, and it will be necessary to keep local communities informed of Project changes and advancements. Community meetings, ongoing communication with community stakeholders, use of social media, and other forms of engagement will be utilized during this period.

Community engagement activities during the Operations phase of the Project will generally focus on:

- Providing communities with Project updates and informing communities of any proposed operational changes (e.g. mine expansions, new infrastructure development).
- Informing communities of training, hiring, and business opportunities during operations and closure/post-closure.
- Identifying community issues and concerns regarding operations-related activities.
- Updating communities on the results of Project monitoring and mitigation programs, and soliciting feedback.
- Providing information and soliciting community feedback on mine reclamation and closure plans and activities.

B2Gold Nunavut will continue to actively engage communities during the Operations phase of the Project. While the mine and its facilities will be very active locations, the Operations phase of the Project will be highly routinized and several socio-economic metrics are anticipated to stabilize. However, operational plans may evolve over the course of the Project; for example, Project expansions

or new operating conditions may be proposed that require new regulatory approvals and community consultation. Community meetings, ongoing communication with community stakeholders, use of social media, and other forms of engagement will be utilized during this period.

Community engagement activities during the Reclamation and Closure, and Post-Closure phases of the Project will generally focus on:

- Providing communities with Project and reclamation and closure-related updates.
- Informing communities of training, hiring, and business opportunities during reclamation and closure, and post-closure.
- Identifying community issues and concerns regarding reclamation and closure-related activities.
- Updating communities on the results of reclamation and closure-focused monitoring and mitigation programs, and soliciting feedback.

Community engagement activities will be less intensive during the Reclamation and Closure, and Post-Closure phases of the Project. Prior to final closure, ore production will permanently stop, much of the infrastructure will be removed from the site, and necessary Project land will be remediated. While effects monitoring will continue, only a small staff of closure professionals will remain at the Project site. Community meetings, ongoing communication with community stakeholders, use of social media, and other forms of engagement will be utilized during this period.

Community engagement activities during the Temporary Closure and Care and Maintenance phases of the Project will generally focus on:

- Providing communities with Project temporary closure and care and maintenance updates.
- Identifying community issues and concerns regarding temporary closure and care and maintenance activities.
- Updating communities on the results of temporary closure and care and maintenance-focused monitoring and mitigation programs, and soliciting feedback.

Community engagement activities are anticipated to be less intensive during the Temporary Closure and Care and Maintenance phases compared to other Project phases. This is because all production activities will be halted, only minimal staff will be employed, and resources available for community engagement and other activities will be significantly reduced.

### **5.1.3 Key Communities and Stakeholders**

B2Gold Nunavut continues to engage regularly with KIA, which is the primary Inuit organization with rights and responsibilities in the Project area. KIA's mandate is "To represent the interests of Kitikmeot Inuit by protecting and promoting our social, cultural, political, environmental and economic well-being." They protect and manage 20% of surface lands (i.e. 103,360 km<sup>2</sup>) in the Kitikmeot Region for the economic and social benefit of their people.

All of the Project's camps and infrastructure are located within the Kitikmeot Region. Accordingly, KIA has been engaged on a regular basis by B2Gold Nunavut. Periodic site visits have been arranged for KIA board members and members of the KIA Lands, Environment, and Resources Department, and KIA has been kept informed of B2Gold Nunavut's various Project developments in an ongoing manner. KIA and B2Gold Nunavut have also collaborated in the development and execution of Project-related TK studies.

KIA is additionally responsible for issuing licences related to land and water use on Inuit Owned Land (IOL) in the Kitikmeot Region, and B2Gold Nunavut is required to post reclamation security and negotiate wildlife compensation with them. B2Gold Nunavut was also required under the Nunavut Agreement to negotiate an IIBA with KIA. As such, regular communication pertaining to these matters has occurred between B2Gold Nunavut and KIA throughout the Project's development. KIA has likewise been an active reviewer and participant in the environmental assessment processes conducted for B2Gold Nunavut's Back River Project.

Kitikmeot Region communities are another key focus of B2Gold Nunavut's public consultation and engagement activities. These communities have been categorized based on the different levels of consultation and engagement employed by B2Gold Nunavut in each location. Categories were determined after considering a community's proximity to the Project, their potential to be affected by Project-related socio-economic and ecosystemic effects, and linkages to other aspects of the Project.

Category 1 communities include those communities closest to the Project and are where the Project will have the strongest ecosystemic or socio-economic influence. Category 1 communities continue to be engaged by B2Gold Nunavut more frequently and intensively than other communities in the region and include Cambridge Bay (Ekaluktutiak), Kugluktuk (Coppermine), Kingaok (Bathurst Inlet), and Omingmaktok (Bay Chimo). Additionally, the focus of B2Gold Nunavut's TK studies have been on these four communities.<sup>1</sup>

Category 2 communities, generally, have lessened socio-economic and cultural ties to the Project area than Category 1 communities. B2Gold Nunavut engages these communities regularly, but not necessarily to the same extent as Category 1 communities. These communities include Gjoa Haven (Ursuqtuq), Taloyoak (Spence Bay), and Kugaaruk (Pelly Bay).

Category 3 communities have lessened socio-cultural and ecosystemic ties to the Project than Category 1 or 2 communities, but may have economic and/or institutional linkages. These communities may also become points-of-hire in the future. Yellowknife, Northwest Territories and Iqaluit, Nunavut are Category 3 communities. B2Gold Nunavut has engaged these communities on a more limited basis.

A number of Northwest Territories Indigenous organizations have also been engaged for the Project. Engagement has occurred primarily through informational meetings with the leadership and other representatives of these organizations. Publicly available TK from these organizations has also been reviewed by B2Gold Nunavut and documented in a report on Northwest Territories TK. In addition, the Athabasca Denesuline Né Né Land Corporation (ADNLC) has been engaged for the Project (primarily regarding potential Project interactions with migrating caribou). The ADNLC represents the three Denesųłiné First Nations of Fond du Lac, Black Lake, and Hatchet Lake in Saskatchewan.

A list of key communities and stakeholders B2Gold Nunavut engages is provided in Table 5.1-2. This list is not a full account of all stakeholders engaged by B2Gold Nunavut, but does reflect the Company's community engagement priorities. In certain situations other groups/individuals may also be considered key stakeholders (e.g. local high schools and elementary schools). A more detailed list of community contacts and stakeholders is maintained by B2Gold Nunavut through an internal

community contacts/stakeholder database (Appendix C). This Plan and its appendices remain living documents that will be regularly updated by B2Gold Nunavut.

#### 5.1.4 Engaging Unique Populations

B2Gold Nunavut understands community engagement methods may need to be modified to reach unique populations more effectively. This could include for specific groups such as women, Elders, and youth. As some members of these groups can experience greater socio-economic vulnerabilities and/or be less likely to participate in community engagement activities than the general public, attention is needed to ensure they are adequately engaged.

B2Gold Nunavut continues to engage and support women, Elders, youth, and other unique populations through a number of means:

- Hosting public meetings that are open to all residents. These meetings are typically held in the evenings to avoid conflicts with daytime commitments (e.g. work, school). Women and families are always welcome to bring their children if they wish, and comment forms are made available to individuals who wish to communicate with B2Gold Nunavut in a written or anonymous manner. Interpretation is available at B2Gold Nunavut's public meetings and key public documents are translated.
- Use of other community-wide forms of engagement. These do not require in-person attendance at a public meeting and include use of call-in radio shows, Nunavut-based offices and staff, newsletters, Company website and social media, and other methods. These help ensure adequate opportunities for information sharing and soliciting feedback occur.
- Community Advisory Groups (CAGs) in Cambridge Bay and Kugluktuk previously included female, Elder, and youth representation. The IEAC has now replaced the CAGs and also includes participation by different demographic groups.
- Visits with elementary and high school students have occurred to discuss the Project, employment opportunities in the mining industry, and to offer other educational experiences to youth.
- Meetings with specific stakeholder groups have occurred where appropriate and/or requested. B2Gold Nunavut is always available for one-on-one conversations with individuals or groups who have unique perspectives to share on the Project.
- B2Gold Nunavut's socio-economic and TK research programs included perspectives from various demographics including women and Elders.
- B2Gold Nunavut's Donations Policy specifically supports initiatives pertaining to 'education and training' and 'community wellness and traditional lifestyles' in Kitikmeot communities, with an emphasis on women and youth. Through B2Gold Nunavut's donations, numerous initiatives benefiting women, Elders, and youth have been funded.
- NIRB public hearings for the Project have included women, Elder, and youth representatives from surrounding communities.
- Per B2Gold Nunavut's *Inuit Human Resources Plan*, the Company is committed to providing a workplace free of all types of harassment or abuse, and has developed appropriate policies to address this issue. Such policies address incidents involving unwelcome comments or actions concerning a person's race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, political beliefs, religion, marital status, physical or mental disability, age, sex, or sexual orientation. B2Gold Nunavut will maintain a zero-tolerance policy for all types of harassment and discrimination.
- B2Gold Nunavut's socio-economic monitoring program includes indicators and information specific to women and youth, including:
  - Gender-specific breakdowns of indicator data for 'number of Project personnel', 'hours worked by Project personnel', 'turnover rate', and 'employee promotions'.
  - Use of youth-focused indicators such as 'secondary school graduation rate', 'Nunavut Arctic College full-time enrollment', 'Inuit apprenticeships', and 'Inuit personnel education'.
  - Inclusion of gender- and youth-specific contextual information and statistics to support indicator monitoring and analysis in B2Gold Nunavut's annual socio-economic monitoring reports.
- B2Gold Nunavut will endeavour to promote its *Community Engagement Plan* and related community feedback mechanisms among vulnerable groups within communities.

Opportunities for improved access to these feedback mechanisms will continue to be assessed and new measures that are better tailored to unique populations may be developed. For example, B2Gold Nunavut will ensure women have opportunities to submit and have their feedback managed by a female representative of the Company, if they desire.

- B2Gold Nunavut may employ a Gender-Based Analysis Plus (GBA+) approach when assessing potential effects of future development activities at the Project (i.e. those subject to a comprehensive NIRB review process). GBA+ is a contemporary approach to examining how intersecting 'identity factors' contribute to differing lived experiences of individuals. It acknowledges that personal experiences of the world are uniquely influenced by factors such as sex, gender identity and expression, ethnicity, age, race, religion, socio-economic class, and place of residence, among others. The application of GBA+ in impact assessment, particularly, is intended to address the disproportionate burden of project-related impacts historically affecting women and other marginalized and disempowered groups.

B2Gold Nunavut also engages and supports Inuit harvesters and land users in the Project area. For example:

- B2Gold Nunavut makes regular efforts to engage the communities of Bathurst Inlet, Bay Chimo, Cambridge Bay, and Kugluktuk, as their residents are known to be the most likely to utilize the Project area. B2Gold Nunavut's TK and land use studies have focused on individuals from these communities and B2Gold Nunavut often meets independently with local Hunter and Trapper Organizations (HTOs) and residents of Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo to provide updates and solicit feedback on the Project.
- B2Gold Nunavut's Donations Policy (Appendix A) includes a separate process regarding transportation of goods and passengers for the communities of Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo to the Project's Port and Marine Laydown Area. The goal is to help support these community members in their desire to pursue traditional livelihoods and spend extended time at Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo, which are the two closest (non-permanent) communities to the Project area.
- B2Gold Nunavut's *Inuit Human Resources Plan* describes rules and procedures pertaining to harvesting and country foods. For example, B2Gold Nunavut has adopted a 'No Harvesting Rule' for all Project staff to avoid unnecessary impacts on wildlife populations and vegetation at Project sites. B2Gold Nunavut also recognizes the rights and needs of individuals who are not employed by the Project but are travelling through the area as part of regular subsistence land use activities. Individuals who are travelling through the area will be supported in pursuit of traditional activities (e.g. potentially provided with food and supplies on request).
- B2Gold Nunavut has developed a Site Visitor Access Policy to support the visitation of community guests and land users to the Marine Laydown Area (MLA). Section 5.1.5, below, provides additional details on this.
- B2Gold Nunavut pursues meaningful contracting opportunities with local Inuit businesses where appropriate. Financial benefits gained through these contracts can support harvesting and traditional livelihoods for some community members; for example, B2Gold Nunavut has established contracts for the Project with Kingaunmiut Services Ltd., an Inuit firm based in Cambridge Bay.
- B2Gold Nunavut's *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan* includes indicators specific to Inuit harvesting and land use in the Project area, including 'number of land use visitor person-days at Project sites', 'number of wildlife compensation payments made', 'number of grievances filed pertaining to the subsistence economy and land use', and 'number of times public use of the Project's Winter Ice Road reported'.

B2Gold Nunavut continues to consider ways unique populations can be better engaged about the Project. The SGM will also remain an avenue through which all stakeholders can bring concerns and grievances forward to B2Gold Nunavut. The Company welcomes stakeholder suggestions on this topic and may adapt its engagement methods accordingly.

### 5.1.5 MLA Site Visitor Access Policy

B2Gold Nunavut understands Inuit land users may occasionally visit Project sites. The Company has developed a Site Visitor Access Policy (Appendix D) to support the visitation of community guests to the MLA. It outlines B2Gold Nunavut's support for community guests wishing to visit and receive assistance from staff and facilities at the MLA. Additionally, this policy aims to provide clarity on the process and safety measures that will be employed to ensure that community guests are accommodated by B2Gold Nunavut to the greatest degree possible at the MLA.

This policy includes details on boat and vehicle anchoring/parking, weapons storage, prohibited items, community guest transportation, supply requests, and emergency support, among other topics. It also includes a Site Visitor Map, outlining where boats and vehicles can be parked, areas that are off-limits to visitors, and directions to camp check-in facilities. This policy and map will continue to be distributed to stakeholders in the Kitikmeot Region, as appropriate.

## 5.2 PROJECT UPDATES

Successful engagement will be based, in part, on timely and transparent communication regarding the status of the Project and related topics including training and employment opportunities. Project updates on matters including progress, current initiatives, and future work have already been initiated and will continue throughout the life of the Project. Community newsletters may be distributed by B2Gold Nunavut and be readily available to the public and local communities. B2Gold Nunavut will provide Project updates to employees, communities, and the public regarding any notable changes to Project activities, including changes to production and operations (such as temporary closure or care and maintenance periods) and shipping schedules. Communication may take place through the following means:

- In-person to employees via managers during staff meetings, which may be followed by informational posts on bulletin boards at locations in Project camps as well as the B2Gold Nunavut offices in Cambridge Bay and Kugluktuk (postings will be provided in English, Inuinnaqtun, and Inuktitut when required).
- Community radio broadcasts that inform listeners of Project updates and other Project-related information.
- Online, through use of Company updates to social media channels (e.g. Facebook), email distribution lists, internal communication tools, and the Company website.
- Public meetings that are open to all community members.
- Stakeholder meetings with HTOs, Hamlets, Indigenous and other community organizations, and governments held periodically at major Project milestones throughout the life of the Project.
- Distribution of Project bulletins or newsletters (provided in English, Inuinnaqtun, and Inuktitut when required) online and in print within Kitikmeot Region communities (printed copies provided in select government offices and public buildings, and directed to individuals who have requested to be kept up-to-date on the Project).

- Distribution of other Project materials including handouts, posters, popular summaries, and Company reports.

Public meetings will remain a primary method used by B2Gold Nunavut to deliver Project updates and provide opportunities for communities to offer feedback. These meetings will typically occur during B2Gold Nunavut's annual community engagement tours held in the Kitikmeot Region. Public meeting presentations made by B2Gold Nunavut may, at minimum, aim to address the following:

- Project overview
- Project updates and opportunities
- Key predicted effects
- Key mitigation measures
- Recent monitoring results
- Recent community feedback received and B2Gold Nunavut's responses to it
- Available community feedback mechanisms and information for contacting B2Gold Nunavut

### 5.3 INCORPORATION OF COMMUNITY INPUT

The Plan was initially developed based on requirements for the FEIS with consideration for issues discussed during socio-economic and land use community research, and annual KSEMC meetings and reports. The results of B2Gold Nunavut's existing community engagement program have also informed the development of the Plan.

Addressing and incorporating public suggestions and concerns related to the Project is a goal B2Gold Nunavut will meet through use of the community engagement methods discussed in Section 5.1.1. This work began early in the environmental assessment process and will continue through the life of the Project. B2Gold Nunavut will continue to provide information and request feedback at public and stakeholder meetings. Community suggestions and concerns may also be elicited during community research and through the use of the Company website and social media posts (in addition to other methods), which provide additional forums for the public to provide feedback.

Public engagement efforts will be evaluated through records of meetings with the public, HTOs, Hamlets, IEAC, governments, and other organizations, and will include review of any feedback provided by community members regarding the engagement process. B2Gold Nunavut will respond to community suggestions and concerns in-person when practical; for example, at community meetings, through the IEAC, and/or through northern staff members and offices, as applicable. Otherwise, responses may be provided in written or other forms. Overall, the Plan is designed to help ensure the timely consideration and resolution of all substantive issues, concerns, and comments raised by stakeholders.

Feedback on specific topics may also be directly solicited by the Company through public and stakeholder meetings, through the B2Gold Nunavut offices in Cambridge Bay and Kugluktuk, meetings with the IEAC, call-in radio shows, and by encouraging local employees and contractors to share their thoughts and suggestions with community relations and management staff. These methods of engagement also provide an effective form of two-way communication and an opportunity for B2Gold Nunavut to provide direct responses to inquiries; for example, comments, suggestions, and/or concerns about the Project. B2Gold Nunavut will also solicit feedback about the Project by providing comment forms at public meetings and commenting opportunities through the Company website, and has established processes to address public feedback in a timely, effective, and transparent

manner. B2Gold Nunavut will track and monitor community views on the issues and concerns that arise through public and stakeholder meetings, public comment forms, and IEAC meetings through a community engagement database. Local employees and contractors will also be encouraged to provide direct feedback on workplace and Project-related issues that arise, including during CLO site visits and Inuit Personnel Surveys.

As noted previously, B2Gold's *Procedure for Management of Community Feedback* provides additional detail on how external stakeholders' feedback will be managed at an operational level, including registering, investigating, resolving, and remedying feedback. Summaries of community feedback received and B2Gold Nunavut's responses to it will also be shared with stakeholders and presented in annual monitoring reports submitted to NIRB.

More substantive community concerns can be brought forward under B2Gold Nunavut's *Stakeholder Grievance Mechanism* (SGM). The SGM describes how B2Gold Nunavut addresses stakeholder grievances for the Project. The SGM serves as a tool to strengthen stakeholder trust and support for the Project, and helps to identify actual and potential impacts B2Gold Nunavut needs to address through corrective actions.

As previously mentioned, B2Gold Nunavut employs northern staff who facilitate the distribution of Project information, maintenance of relationships, and receipt of community feedback about the Project. They will also serve as a point of contact for community members wishing to access the SGM. Multiple community engagement methods will continue to be used throughout the life of the Project. B2Gold Nunavut's adaptive management approach further enables the continual integration of community input into the design and implementation of the Plan, and wider Project.

#### 5.4 PROMOTION OF INUIT PARTICIPATION IN EMPLOYMENT AND CONTRACTING OPPORTUNITIES

B2Gold Nunavut's approach to promoting Inuit participation in Project employment and contracting opportunities is detailed more fully in the *Inuit Human Resources Plan* and *Inuit Business Development Plan*.

#### 5.5 COMMUNICATION OF RESEARCH AND MONITORING RESULTS

Results of community research conducted on social, cultural, and ecological conditions will be publicly available on the NIRB public registry (<https://www.nirb.ca/application>). The information available will include all submissions included as part of the FEIS, as well as on-going annual environmental and socio-economic monitoring reports. If additional research or studies are conducted over the course of Project Construction or Operations on topics other than those defined by the monitoring programs, these results may also be shared with NIRB and communities, where appropriate. B2Gold Nunavut acknowledges the requirements of the *Scientists Act* (Nunavut) and commits to ensuring that legislated reporting requirements under the *Scientists Act* are followed when communicating (and reporting) research results.

## 6. Monitoring, Reporting, and Plan Effectiveness

---

### 6.1 MONITORING

A *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan* has been developed to help ensure the Project fulfills best practices in social responsibility as it relates to community engagement, capacity building, and realization of benefits from the Project, especially for Inuit. Equally, monitoring will provide relevant and timely information to enable Project managers and community leaders to respond proactively to potential risks and adverse socio-economic effects.

To help support management measures associated with this and other plans, a number of Project-specific and community-level indicators have been defined in the *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan*. Monitoring is designed to measure social performance broadly with respect to topics such as health and community well-being, as well as traditional and non-traditional land use. Other monitoring of achievements with respect to employment, education, and training are identified relevant to the *Inuit Human Resources Plan*. Monitoring of achievements with respect to economic development and business opportunities are identified relevant to the *Inuit Business Development Plan*. Monitoring of community grievances through the *Stakeholder Grievance Mechanism* is also addressed.

Thresholds may be developed for some indicators in the future and may be done in consultation with relevant stakeholders (e.g. SEMWG). Where Project performance is addressed by the IIBA, it is anticipated that applicable thresholds from the IIBA may be used. In other cases, residual effects may be assessed (i.e. using indicator data) against selected parameters from the FEIS including direction (e.g. positive, negative) and where appropriate, magnitude. In these cases, management actions may be triggered when annual performance is below threshold/parameter. This may involve an evaluation of the existing mitigation and management measures, and identification of appropriate adjustments. Thresholds may be identified in the *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan*, if appropriate, in the future.

The *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan* details the approach and methods through which Project socio-economic outcomes will be monitored and reported. B2Gold Nunavut will also incorporate community perspectives and Traditional Knowledge (TK) into the Project's various monitoring programs, and has developed guidance on how this will occur ( see: 'Guidance for Incorporating Community Perspectives and Traditional Knowledge in the Back River Project's Monitoring Programs' included in the *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan*). Specifically, B2Gold Nunavut's monitoring reports may include information on:

- Relevant community engagement and TK activities undertaken during the previous year.
- How community perspectives and TK informed the design and content of the monitoring program.
- How community perspectives and TK informed the results of the monitoring program (including feedback provided).
- Any noted discrepancies between TK and scientific knowledge.
- Responses to key concerns identified through community engagement and TK.
- How community perspectives and TK informed adaptive management for the Project.

Ongoing engagement at the community level will be documented and relevant feedback will be integrated into the Project. This will be facilitated through use of a community engagement database

to record and categorize community feedback that is shared with B2Gold Nunavut. Engagement activities and findings will also be documented in B2Gold Nunavut's Annual Report to NIRB and/or its annual Socio-Economic Monitoring Report. In addition, a rolling Community Engagement 4-Year Plan (Appendix B) will be used as an internal reference and tool to measure the success of annual engagement objectives and planned activities against.

Per B2Gold's *Procedure for Management of Community Feedback*, a series of internal Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) shall also be tracked, reported on, and assessed for trends in operational or community risks and impacts and overall performance of community feedback management.

## 6.2 REPORTING AND PLAN EFFECTIVENESS

As part of the *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan*, relevant findings from the socio-economic monitoring program will be reviewed in collaboration with members of the KSEMC, SEMWG, communities, and NIRB. Key findings and recommendations will be incorporated into an annual report to NIRB. More generally, B2Gold Nunavut will incorporate community perspectives and TK into the Project's various monitoring programs, and has developed guidance on how this will occur (see the *Socio-Economic Monitoring Plan* for additional details).

B2Gold Nunavut will ensure relevant consultation findings are thoroughly documented in its Annual Reports to NIRB and/or annual Socio-Economic Monitoring Reports. Where appropriate, these will detail how community feedback and comments have been taken into account to adapt, adjust, review, and/or improve the Project's mitigation measures to ensure they are efficient and performant. Affected communities and stakeholders will continue to be directly consulted and involved in the monitoring program to assess potential impacts on their livelihoods throughout Construction and Operations. This will occur through regular engagement of the KSEMC and IEAC, and by providing monitoring updates and soliciting community feedback on Project operations during B2Gold Nunavut's annual community engagement tours. Progress on addressing feedback provided and issues identified through community engagement (including those identified through the SGM if appropriate) will also occur.

Tracking of community engagement activities will be conducted by B2Gold Nunavut in an ongoing manner, through the following:

- Community Engagement Log (Appendix E)
- Community Engagement Attempted Meetings Log (Appendix F)
- Donations Log (Appendix G)
- Meeting notes
- Community engagement database<sup>2</sup>

The Plan will be reviewed annually by B2Gold Nunavut for potential improvements. Likewise, the Plan will evolve to reflect emerging best practices and any significant Project changes. Modifications to

the Plan may be described in annual reports and revised versions of the Plan will be prepared and distributed to appropriate parties, as necessary. Reports on Plan outcomes and performance, as well as any recommended additional adaptive management actions, will also be prepared for internal Company distribution and use, as required. The Plan will be evaluated against its defined scope and objectives (Section 2). Relevant findings may be shared with NIRB.

## 7. Summary

---

This Plan aims to help minimize negative effects and maximize or enhance potential benefits of the Project within the Kitikmeot Region's communities. The objective of the Plan is to fulfil the Project's public engagement commitments and maintain meaningful relationships with local communities and public stakeholders. The Plan outlines efforts B2Gold Nunavut will make to communicate and engage with residents, communities, and stakeholders throughout the life of the Project. Specifically, the Plan describes B2Gold Nunavut's commitment to provide Project updates, incorporate community input, promote Inuit participation in employment and contracting opportunities, and communicate research and monitoring results.

The socio-economic monitoring program will provide information to assist in managing outcomes of this and other plans and will collect and analyze information on various conditions and trends, while addressing other requirements. The monitoring program will inform the ongoing management and mitigation of potential social and economic effects identified in the FEIS and will facilitate best practices in social responsibility as it relates to community engagement, capacity building, and realization of benefits from the Project. The monitoring program has also been established to enable Project managers and community leaders to respond proactively and in a timely manner to any undesirable changes to socio-economic conditions.

B2Gold Nunavut recognizes the Project will present Inuit communities with both substantial opportunities as well as changes to current social and economic conditions. B2Gold Nunavut is committed to implementing measures to enhance the benefits of the Project for individuals residing in the Kitikmeot Region. Mitigating existing and potential impacts, and promoting individual, family, and community well-being is a shared responsibility of B2Gold Nunavut, KIA, hamlets, and the GN. Commitments to enhance regional employment and training, and the provision of community programs and services to enhance community well-being do not impose responsibility on B2Gold Nunavut to assume the role of government. B2Gold Nunavut will cooperate in these efforts. For the benefits of the Project to be fully realized at the local level communities must be engaged in the implementation of strategies to build capacity to enhance well-being, which contributes to their ability to deal with current and future challenges and to retain benefits beyond the life of the Project.

Adaptive management is a method used in the creation and implementation of the Plan, and the monitoring program enables engaged parties to instigate change where required and to employ the use of new data and best practices as they become available. Further, the adoption of adaptive management practices enables engaged parties to adjust plans based on pertinent community feedback throughout the life of the Project.

# Appendix A: Donations Policy

---

## DONATIONS PROCEDURE

### Purpose and Goal

The purpose of this Procedure is to outline the criteria and procedures for assessing donation requests made to B2Gold Back River Corp. (B2Gold Nunavut or the Company) regarding the Back River Project (Project). The goal of this Procedure is to support community-based initiatives that enhance the socio-economic development of the Kitikmeot Region and which reflect positively upon B2Gold Nunavut.

### Donations Criteria

Donations made by B2Gold Nunavut will focus on supporting initiatives pertaining to 'education and training' and 'community wellness and traditional lifestyles' in Kitikmeot communities (i.e. Cambridge Bay, Kugluktuk, Bathurst Inlet, Bay Chimo, Gjoa Haven, Taloyoak, and Kugaaruk), with an emphasis on women and youth. These represent important socio-economic priorities for the Kitikmeot Region and/or will support known vulnerable and disadvantaged groups that may benefit from B2Gold Nunavut contributions. B2Gold Nunavut will prioritize financial and in-kind contributions that build on existing community programs and strengths. B2Gold Nunavut will consider contributions in the following areas, amongst others:

- Education and Training
  - Financial and physical material contributions to local daycares and community-based educational programs
  - Ad-hoc donations to schools
  - Visits with high school students to discuss careers in mining
  - Mine site visits for high school graduates and/or promising students
  - Awards for students enrolled in mining-oriented post-secondary educational programs
  - Laptops (or other useful items) for new high school graduates
  - Support for regional mining-focused training initiatives
  - Support for women and youth-specific employment, training, and educational opportunities
  
- Community Wellness and Traditional Lifestyles
  - Donations to community health and wellness groups and programs (including mental health, healthy living, and healing initiatives)
  - Financial and physical material contributions to local Elder, youth, men, women, and harvesters' organizations and initiatives
  - Financial and in-kind contributions for community TK camps
  - Sponsorship of traditional gatherings and events
  - Community event sponsorship (e.g. for annual spring 'Frolics' festivals that take place in some Kitikmeot communities)
  - Support for local heritage groups and projects
  - Support for local sports teams and extra-curricular youth programming (e.g. providing jerseys, equipment, tournament and field trip sponsorship)





Donations or in-kind contributions of less than \$10,000/year may be individually approved by the Director, Indigenous & Northern Affairs. Donations or in-kind contributions of more than \$20,000 must be approved by the Vice President, Sustainability. B2Gold Nunavut's Accounts Payable department must be copied on all donation approvals for processing. All donation amounts must fall within approved the approved budget.

In the event a donation request is denied, an email or cover letter should be issued to the applicant explaining why.

### **Procedure for Issuing, Documenting, and Publicizing Donations**

Donations issued by B2Gold Nunavut are to be accompanied by a covering letter (Appendix B). Donation recipients should be informed that their name, organization, and donation amounts may be noted in public reports and presentations. A follow-up letter or email (with photos, if appropriate) on how the donation was used will also be requested.

All donations issued by B2Gold Nunavut are to be formally documented using a 'Donations Log'. The master copy of this log will be the responsibility of the Senior Coordinator, Indigenous Affairs in Kugluktuk to maintain.

Wherever possible donations should be publicized through B2Gold Nunavut's Facebook or Twitter accounts. This should include a short summary about the donation and recipient, and an accompanying photo(s), if available.



Appendix A – Process for Managing Requests from Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo for the Transportation of Goods and/or People

## Process for Managing Requests from Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo for the Transportation of Goods and/or People

### Purpose and Goal

The purpose of this process is to outline the criteria and procedures regarding the transportation by B2Gold Nunavut of goods and passengers for the community members of Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo, to B2Gold Nunavut's Marine Laydown Area (MLA) at the Back River Project (Project). The goal of this process is to help support these community members in their desire to pursue traditional livelihoods and spend extended time at Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo. To the extent feasible, this process is intended to benefit these communities as a whole; B2Gold Nunavut will attempt to provide support in a balanced manner that does not concentrate benefits amongst certain individuals or families.

### Transportation of Goods - Criteria and Procedure

As a good corporate citizen, B2Gold Nunavut has committed to assisting the community members of Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo in the transportation of goods to the MLA. Requests for the transportation of goods can be made by contacting the Supervisor, Community Relations located in Cambridge Bay or Senior Coordinator, Indigenous Affairs in Kugluktuk. Following approval by the Director, Indigenous & Northern Affairs, it is the sole responsibility of the community member(s) to ensure the goods are purchased and packed appropriately for transportation including clear labelling with sender/recipient name(s), contact information, and destination of goods (e.g. Bathurst Inlet, NU). Goods must be dropped off at a pre-approved location (specific location to be determined by B2Gold Nunavut on a case-by-case basis; e.g. Yellowknife, Cambridge Bay, Hay River) in order to be transported.

Goods will only be transported as far as the MLA. Once the goods have arrived at the MLA, the appropriate B2Gold Nunavut employees will contact the designated community member(s). It is the sole responsibility of the community member(s) to retrieve their goods from the MLA within 3 days of being contacted.

All goods being requested for transport must be purchased by the requesting party. B2Gold Nunavut does not intend to purchase large quantities of goods (e.g. bulk fuel) for transport to Project sites through this Donations Procedure.

### Transportation of goods - Via Sealift:

B2Gold Nunavut anticipates allocating the equivalent of approximately 2 shipping containers/year (total) in cargo allowance by sealift for the communities of Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo. Please note, shipping containers can be provided by B2Gold Nunavut. Transportation of cargo in exceedance of this allowance may be considered on an ad-hoc basis, but additional transportation charges may apply. If for any reason a sealift is unable to reach the Port in a given year, B2Gold Nunavut will not be held responsible for undelivered goods.

Community requests for the transportation of goods via sealift must be made by March 1 of each year, to allow sufficient time to plan and organize annual sealift activities.

## 1. Introduction

This Policy describes the process by which B2Gold Back River Corp. (B2Gold Nunavut or the Company) shall support the visitation of community guests to the Marine Laydown Area (MLA).

## 2. Scope and Objectives

The objective of the Procedure is to outline B2Gold Nunavut support for community guests wishing to visit and receive assistance from staff and facilities at the Marine Laydown Area.

Additionally, this policy aims to provide clarity on the process and safety measures that will be employed to ensure that community guests are accommodated by B2Gold Nunavut to the greatest degree possible at the MLA.

Please refer to the 'Donations Policy' process for managing requests from Bathurst Inlet and Bay Chimo for the transportation of goods and/or people as and when a request is received.

## 3. Roles and Responsibilities

Implementation of the Policy, as well as on-going performance evaluations, updates, or revisions to the Policy, will be the responsibility of the Director, Indigenous & Northern Affairs, or other designated management representative.

It is the responsibility of the most senior B2Gold Nunavut representative at the MLA to ensure that all community guests are welcomed and accommodated to the greatest degree possible and in line with this Policy, the Back River Project Inuit Impact and Benefit Agreement (IIBA) and Nunavut Agreement.

It is the responsibility of the MLA Site Services team to ensure supports are provided to community guests in line with this Policy.

It is the responsibility of all MLA Project personnel to be kind, courteous, and welcoming to all community guests.

It is the responsibility of community guests to ensure they follow this Policy.

It is the responsibility of the Indigenous & Northern Affairs team to communicate with community guests about this Policy and to support implementation of the same.

## 4. Boat and Vehicle Anchoring/Parking

Please find attached Appendix A 'MLA Visitor Site Map'.

As shown on the map, all-terrain vehicles (ATV), and snowmobiles are to be parked in the designated area near the desalination plant. Vehicles parked in the designated area shall only be moved to other areas of camp when under escort of a B2Gold Nunavut employee.

As shown on the map, boats are to be tied up at the floating dock.

## 5. Weapons Storage

B2Gold Nunavut has zero-tolerance for weapons of any kind being brought into Project areas. This includes weapons belonging to any community guests.

All weapons including but not limited to firearms and knives are to be left at the community guests' vehicle or boat prior to entry into MLA facilities.

Should the community guest not wish to leave their weapon outside, safely stored on their boat, ATV, or snowmobile, it must be turned over to the most senior B2Gold Nunavut employee on site, or designate, and be stored securely in the MLA firearm storage cabinet prior to MLA facility entry or travel around camp. It shall be returned to the community guest outside of camp facilities upon departure.

## 6. Prohibited Items

B2Gold Nunavut has zero-tolerance for drugs (any substance (illegal or otherwise), the use of which has the potential to negatively impact a person's judgment, perception, dexterity or motor control) and alcohol being in Project areas.

Guests shall be informed of this this policy by the senior B2Gold Nunavut representative upon arrival at Project sites.

## 7. Community Guest Transportation

B2Gold Nunavut shall provide ground transportation for all community guests from the designated parking area or floating dock when a request is made to visit a MLA facility. Ground transportation is provided to ensure that the community guest is not walking through the Project area to MLA facilities without the required personal protective equipment or B2Gold Nunavut escort.

## 8. Supply Requests

Should B2Gold Nunavut receive a request for supplies the Company will provide the following:

- **Food and Beverages**- Shall be supplied in the form of a hot meal if available.
- **Provisions**- Shall be supplied by B2Gold Nunavut when requested. These provisions may include food (fresh and dry goods), and medical supplies.

Fresh food provisions shall be limited to what a family of 5 would require for 3 days. Dry good provisions shall be limited to what a family of 5 would require for 5 days.

Medical supplies shall be provided as requested and in discussion with the onsite medic to ensure that what is supplied does not reduce B2Gold Nunavut's ability to provide care in the event of a medical event at the MLA. See Section 12 for emergency support.

- **Gasoline**- Shall be provided when requested. Due to the low volumes of gasoline kept at the MLA at any one time, the amount of fuel being provided is to be weighed against any MLA requirements for gasoline. It will be at the discretion of the most senior B2Gold Nunavut representative on site, or designate, to determine the amount of fuel that can be provided at any one time. However, the amount of gasoline being provided shall not exceed 2 fuel drums (400 liters) at any one time. This is of course unless the gasoline being requested is the property of the community guest and was brought to the MLA at their request by B2Gold Nunavut.
- **Diesel**- Shall be provided when requested. It will be at the discretion of the most senior B2Gold Nunavut representative on site, or designate, to determine the amount of diesel that can be provided at any one time. However, the amount of diesel being provided shall not exceed 2 fuel drums (400 liters) at any one time.

B2Gold Nunavut shall, through the Indigenous & Northern Affairs team, consider requests for moving supplies to and from the MLA for community groups. This may include the shipping and storage of goods on site for pickup by community guests. These requests shall be provided to the Director, Indigenous & Northern Affairs who shall liaise with the General Manager, Goose Site or their designate as needed.

## 9. Advance Notice

The Indigenous & Northern Affairs team shall communicate this policy to community groups who may travel to the MLA. As part of its communication of this Policy the Indigenous & Northern Affairs team shall request that community groups provide advance notice of travel to the MLA to B2Gold Nunavut. This notice should be provided to the Supervisor, Community Relations and Senior Coordinator, Indigenous Affairs, at least 7 days prior to expected arrival at the MLA.

B2Gold Nunavut recognizes that stops at the MLA by community guests may be unintended or unplanned and shall act in accordance with this Policy should community guests arrive unexpectedly.

## 10. Emergency Support

In the event of an emergency that causes a community guest to stop at the MLA, B2Gold Nunavut shall provide all support required up to and including arranging for a medevac through the Government of Nunavut.

In the event of a medical emergency being experienced by a community guest, the MLA medic and B2Gold Nunavut Health & Safety team shall work to ensure that all reasonable care is provided. In the event where a medevac is required that will be arranged by B2Gold Nunavut's Health & Safety team in accordance with established policies and procedures.

In the event of inclement weather, or another emergency that endangers the health and safety of community guests, B2Gold Nunavut shall provide accommodations. Should accommodations be provided, the community guests are to be provided a site safety orientation including on emergency procedures.


### Unexpected Visits to the MLA
