

PREVIOUSLY-SCREENED PROJECT PROPOSAL:

As previously screened by the NIRB (File No. 12XN020) the “Eureka Weather Station Facility” project proposal was located within the Qikiqtani Region, approximately 407 kilometres (km) northwest of Grise Fiord, on Crown Land Reserve #1021. The Proponent indicated that it intended to continued operations of the existing Eureka Weather Station which was originally established in 1983, and has been in operation since 1947. The facility would operate year round with the purpose of collecting meteorological information and providing logistical support for research, exploration, military operations, and tour groups.

The proposed project included:

- Operations and maintenance of all of the existing Eureka infrastructure, specifically:
 - Airstrip and all access roads,
 - Tankfarm and fuel supply system,
 - Water and sewage lagoons,
 - Heating and electricity,
 - Biotreatment cell (landfarm),
 - Disposal/burning of non-hazardous landfill,
 - Hazardous materials collected and barged off site to be disposed of appropriately, and
 - Accommodations, laboratories, and general storage and warehousing
- Ongoing use of the Eureka as a base camp and logistical support/staging areas for other entities/organizations such as the Department of National Defence and NRCAN’s Polar Continental Shelf Program.

CURRENT APPLICATION:

EC is currently proposing to extend its Land Use Permit No.: N2012N0012 with AANDC from May 30, 2014 to May 30, 2016 to continue operations of the facility for previously approved activities.

Please note that Section 12.4.3 of the NLCA states that:

“Any application for a component or activity of a project proposal that has been permitted to proceed in accordance with these provisions shall be exempt from the requirement for screening by NIRB unless:

(a) such component or activity was not part of the original project proposal; or

(b) its inclusion would significantly modify the project.”

After completing a review of the information provided in support of the current application, the NIRB is of the understanding that the proposed extension does not change the general scope of

the original project activities, and the exceptions noted in NLCA 12.4.3(a) and (b) do not apply. Therefore, this application is exempt from the requirement for screening pursuant to Section 12.4.3 of the NLCA and the activities therein remain subject to the terms and conditions recommended in the original May 30, 2012 Screening Decision Report (enclosed).
