The key fact sheet was presented.

Questions asked:

- When will you do your project in reference to boat season? Agnico Eagle: We are hoping to finish in June.
- There are people accessing their cabins via the area where you will build the bypass road. AEM asked if it's a trail? They said yes. Agnico Eagle: Ensure a ski-doo trail is marked and that signage is present.
- Laydown area: Could you draw exactly where pipeline will go? We have approach lighting and underground cables, so we need to know where you will do what exactly. AEM to provide engineering drawing, including elevations, location of infrastructures and pipeline connections for laydown area. .
- Will you affect our potential industrial site (Hamlet). AEM: No.
- Will you secure the site with fence or boulders. AEM answer: we will put boulders on top of quarry and fence on floor of quarry.
- Do you know that there are cabins by the laydown area and potentially other cabins by quarry area. The Hamlet recommends we try to contact them via radio or facebook page. Agnico Eagle to discuss with cabin owners.
