PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Iqaluit Power Plant Bulk Fuel Storage Upgrade” project is located within the Qikiqtani (South Baffin) region, within the municipal boundaries of Iqaluit. The Proponent intends to make upgrades to the existing Iqaluit Bulk Storage Tank Farm associated with the City’s main power plant to increase diesel fuel storage capacity. The construction program is proposed from May 2018 to August 2019. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Expand and upgrade existing tank farm facility
- Construction and installation of a new 5,700,000 litres (L) tank
- Conduct hydrostatic testing on tank #2 to ensure soundness of all welds and joints
- Use of heavy equipment (excavator and crane) to undertake civil and electrical works
