PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Gibson MacQuoid Gold Project” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 100 kilometres (km) from Baker Lake. The Proponent intends to amend the scope of previously approved activities to include a temporary camp with fuel cache to support the ongoing mineral exploration activities. The program is proposed to take place from August to September 2018. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Construction and use of a temporary camp (between 30 and 40 personnel) to support exploration program
- Use of a helicopter for daily transportation to and from the camp and the sample sites
- Use of an aircraft for transportation of all personnel, equipment and supplies at the beginning and end of the field season to and from Baker Lake
- Ongoing daily collection of high resolution imagery with the use of a drone
