<b>CONCERNS</b>	
<p>The Proponent intends to engage in sightseeing of birds and wildlife on Prince Leopold Island Migratory Bird Sanctuary during the course of this Project. Under Project Authorizations in the Proponents application to the Nunavut Impact Review Board they have not indicated that they will apply for a Wildlife Observation permit from the Department of Environment.</p>	
<b>SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</b>	
<p>The Proponent should obtain a Wildlife Observation license from the Government of Nunavut prior to the commencement of any sightseeing activities.</p>

<b>CONCERNS</b>	
<p>A search of the Nunavut Archaeological Site Database indicates that there are a total of eleven (11) archaeological sites in the proposed areas of interest (Prince Leopold Island and Nirjutiqavvik National Wildlife Area (Nirjutiqavvik)). This however does not preclude the presence of unrecorded sites or cultural features as the area has not been the object of systematic archaeological surveys.</p> <p>The proponent plans to conduct tourist activities on Prince Leopold Island and Nirjutiqavvik, including four (4) to five (5) aircraft excursions per season of twelve (12) tourists per trip. The two locations proposed for the tourism activities have numerous identified archaeological sites with a high concentration of sites at Nirjutiqavvik.</p> <p>Culture and Heritage also notes that the proponent will be operating an aircraft on unimproved landing areas.</p>	
<b>SUGGESTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS</b>	
<p>The Department of Culture and Heritage recommends that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) The proponent exercises caution in their movements in the area, specifically with regards to aircraft landings. It is recommended that the landing area be visually inspected prior to landing and takeoff.</li> <li>(2) The proponent should avoid conducting activities in the vicinity (50 m buffer zone) of archaeological/historical sites. If archaeological sites or features are encountered, activities should immediately be interrupted and moved away from this location. Each site encountered needs to be recorded and reported to our office.</li> </ol> <p>All archaeological and palaeontological sites in Nunavut are protected under the Nunavut Act. The Proponent must understand that it is their responsibility to ensure that no heritage resource sites are disturbed in the course of their activities. No person shall alter, or otherwise disturb an archaeological site, or remove any artifact from an archaeological site without the proper authorizations. Moreover, the building of inuksuit is not recommended.</p>
