## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Kivalliq Hydro-Fibre Link Baseline Research” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately corridor from Manitoba boundary to Chesterfield Inlet and then inland to Baker Lake and the Meadowbank Mine. The Proponent intends to conduct several fieldwork activities to support the ongoing project design, evaluation and development of the Kivalliq Hydro-Fibre Link (KHFL). These activities are focused on gathering information about the wildlife biology, vegetation, aquatics, geomorphology, and permafrost conditions of the region. The program is proposed to take place from August 2021 to August 2023. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Migratory birds survey including waterfowl along the proposed corridor;
- Terrestrial wildlife survey;
- Fish and fish habitat survey
- A targeted field program to validate preliminary desktop-based mapping of the proposed KHFL project corridor, including
