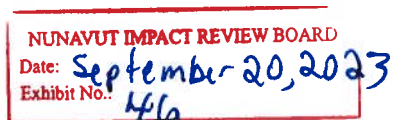


**Kivalliq Inuit Association Terms and Conditions for the Reconsideration of the Meliadine Extension Proposal**

**Proposed New Term and Condition**

<b>NEW Term and Condition No.</b>	44a New Term and Condition for the Meliadine Extension
<b>Category</b>	Terrestrial Wildlife and Wildlife Habitat- Caribou monitoring and mitigation
<b>Responsible Parties</b>	The Proponent, Government of Nunavut, and other participants in the Terrestrial Advisory Group (TAG)
<b>Project Phase</b>	Pre-construction, Construction, Operations, Temporary Closure/Care and Maintenance, Closure and Post-Closure Monitoring
<b>Objective</b>	To adaptively mitigate impacts on caribou based on ongoing monitoring results.
<b>Term or Condition</b>	<p>The Proponent will work with the other TAG members to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>review and revise the Commitment 38 analysis and the report,</li><li>analyze available caribou monitoring data including as informed by Inuit knowledge, including Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, and Indigenous Knowledge,</li><li>assess the effectiveness of the existing caribou monitoring and mitigation measures, and</li><li>determine whether and how to strengthen these monitoring and mitigation measures based on that data, the application of the precautionary principle and the application of Inuit knowledge, including Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, and Indigenous Knowledge.</li></ol> <p>The Proponent will implement the TAG's consensus recommendations on the above matters. If the TAG cannot reach consensus recommendations on any of the above matters within a reasonable time period that is no more than six months from the issuance of an amended project certificate, the Proponent will bring the matter(s) to the NIRB for direction prior to the start of construction on any components of the Meliadine Extension.</p>
<b>Reporting Requirement</b>	Results of discussions, implementation of measures, updates to all relevant Plans, and monitoring results shall be reported and discussed in the Proponent's annual report to the NIRB.





#### **Proposed Revision to Term and Condition 44**

<b>REVISED/Varied Term and Condition No.</b>	<i>44 Modified and Varied for the Waterlines Proposal</i>
<b>Category</b>	Terrestrial Wildlife and Wildlife Habitat – Caribou monitoring
<b>Responsible Parties REVISED</b>	The Proponent, Government of Nunavut, <b><u>and other participants in the Terrestrial Advisory Group (TAG)</u></b>
<b>Project Phase</b>	Pre-construction, Construction, Operations, Temporary Closure/Care and Maintenance, Closure and Post-Closure Monitoring
<b>Objective</b>	To further define details of monitoring programs
<b>Term or Condition REVISED/Varied:</b>	<p>In consultation with the Government of Nunavut (GN) and other relevant parties, <b><u>such as the Terrestrial Advisory Group</u></b>, the Proponent shall further develop its Terrestrial Environment Management and Monitoring Plan (TEMMP) to include increased caribou monitoring across the regional study area and additional details on the scope and design of monitoring programs. The Proponent shall also demonstrate consideration for contributing to existing and planned regional monitoring initiatives associated with terrestrial wildlife and wildlife habitat <b><u>and the incorporation of Inuit Qaujimaningit, Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, Traditional and Community Knowledge</u></b>, as appropriate. Monitoring should be adequate to test impact predictions, monitor impact thresholds and trends over time, and to support implementation of <b><u>adaptive</u></b> mitigation measures as proposed in the Final Environmental Impact Statement <b><u>and any subsequent Addenda submitted by the Proponent. The Proponent in consultation with the Terrestrial Advisory Group shall revise the 2021 Technical Memorandum entitled “Collared Caribou Meliadine All-Weather Access Road Interactions” describing the crossings and deflections of caribou in relation to the all-weather access road as assessed using caribou collar data and shall provide a copy to the NIRB prior to construction/installation of the waterlines.</u></b></p>
<b>Reporting Requirement</b>	Results of discussions, implementation of measures, updates to the Plan, and monitoring results shall be reported and discussed in the Proponent's annual report to the NIRB.



#### **Proposed Variation of Term and Condition 54**

As this Term and Condition was previously Modified, the proposed revision is italicized and highlighted in yellow.

<b>REVISED/<i>Varied</i></b> <b>Term and Condition No.</b>	<b><i>54 Modified for the Waterlines Proposal and Varied for the Meliadine Extension Proposal</i></b>
<b>Category REVISED</b>	Terrestrial Wildlife and Wildlife Habitat – Movement of wildlife
<b>Responsible Parties</b>	The Proponent
<b>Project Phase</b>	Pre-construction, Construction, Operations, Temporary Closure/Care and Maintenance, Closure and Post-Closure Monitoring
<b>Objective</b>	To ensure Project infrastructure does not prevent or unduly limit the movement of wildlife
<b>Term or Condition REVISED:</b>	The Proponent shall ensure that road safety barriers, <del>or</del> berms, <b><i>or waterline coverings</i></b> associated with Project infrastructure, all-weather access road and associated roads/trails <b><i>and the waterlines</i></b> are constructed to allow for the safe passage of caribou, <b><i>including emphasis on newborn caribou calving,</i></b> and other terrestrial wildlife while achieving the objective of separating public road use with Project-related mine traffic <del>or</del> <b><i>transport of saline effluent. The Proponent shall develop a specific Calving Protection Plan that ensures that Project Infrastructure and activities, do not restrict the movement of caribou, including an emphasis on newborn caribou calves. The Calving Protection Plan shall include sufficient and reliable mitigation measures to reduce sensory disturbance to calving caribou and newborn caribou calves.</i></b>
<b>Reporting Requirement</b>	The Proponent shall provide a summary discussion of its implementation of this term and condition to the NIRB through the Proponent's annual monitoring report.



### **New Term and Condition**

<b>NEW Term and Condition No.</b>	<b><i>New Term and Condition for the Meliadine Extension related to Cumulative Impacts Analysis</i></b>
<b>Category</b>	Terrestrial Wildlife and Wildlife Habitat —Reporting
<b>Responsible Parties</b>	The Proponent
<b>Project Phase</b>	Construction, Operations, Temporary Closure /Care and Maintenance, Closure and Post-Closure Monitoring
<b>Objective</b>	To mitigate and monitor for impacts to wildlife
<b>Term or Condition:</b>	The Proponent shall, in consultation with the Terrestrial Advisory Group (TAG), determine the methodology, design an approach to a cumulative impact analysis that includes an approach to considering the impacts of climate change on the Project, and after which, the Proponent shall undertake a cumulative impact analysis at the caribou population scale to develop thresholds to ensure the resilience is not decreased nor the Qamanirjuaq herd vulnerability increased.
<b>Reporting Requirement</b>	The Proponent shall provide the NIRB with a copy of the cumulative impact analysis prior to construction of any of the proposed components of the Meliadine Extension.
