The Proponent intends to conduct a commercial tourism voyage on an expedition cruise vessel in 2022 and again in 2023. The program is proposed to take place from August 2022 to September 2022. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Transit of the cruise vessel M/V Greg Mortimer from Greenland to Cambridge Bay and return to Greenland
- Tourism including shore landings, community visits
- Transportation of passengers by zodiacs
- Kayaking tours for the passengers
