Re: Request to Use Agnico Eagle's All-weather Access Road for On-the-Land Addictions Treatment Program

Dear Mrs. Hauili,

Following the request received from Pulaarvik Kablu Friendship Centre on May 20, 2024, and a previous discussion on October 24, 2022, Agnico Eagle Mines Limited (Agnico Eagle) is writing regarding the use of Agnico Eagle's All-weather Access Road (AWAR) to support an On-the-Land Addictions Treatment Program held in cabins located east of the AWAR (referred to as the Treatment Program).

Agnico Eagle formally approves the use of the AWAR to KM9 but will not be responsible for any incident or loss. Agnico Eagle also understands that the Kivalliq Inuit Association, lessor of road lease KVRW11F02 on which part of the AWAR is located, supports the above activities.

The following rules apply when driving on the AWAR:

- Maximum speed limit of 50 km/h;
- Wildlife has right-of-way;
- AWAR will be closed during caribou migration and cyanide transportation;
- Traffic may be restricted during waterline construction;
- Vehicles should not park on the roadway, but in a safe place, such as pullouts.
