## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Whale Cove Mobile Wind Resource Assessment Project” is located within the Kivalliq region, Within the municipal boundaries of the community of Whale Cove. The Proponent intends to collect wind data using a sonic detection and ranging (SONAR) device to assess the feasibility of a utility-scale wind energy project. The program is proposed to take place from August 2024 to October 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Set up and deployment of Sonic Detection and Ranging (SODAR) device and equipment within two (2) kilometres of the community of Whale Cove;
- Hiring and training of local community members to help with maintenance checks;
- Use of an ATV to transport personnel and equipment to research site; and
- Accommodation and use of facilities within the community of Whale Cove.
