

Emergency Response Plan – Oden land project

1. Communication and Coordination:

- In case of emergencies, we rely on our satellite phones and Garmin InReach beacons for crucial communication in remote areas. These devices ensure that we can always maintain contact with our team and emergency services.

2. Medical Preparedness:

- **Medical Personnel:** A nurse and a medical doctor will be available onboard Oden, equipped to handle medical emergencies and provide immediate first aid.
- **First Aid Kits:** Each team member carries essential first aid kits, crucial for treating injuries and minor medical issues during our expedition.
- **Emergency Medical Protocols:** We have established clear protocols for handling medical emergencies, including procedures for evacuation if advanced medical care is necessary.

3. Wildlife and Safety Measures:

- **Rifles and Bear Spray:** Our teams are equipped with rifles and bear spray to protect against wildlife encounters. These will be used for protection only as deterrents in case of close encounter.
- **Training:** We have received comprehensive training in wildlife safety, including protocols for bear encounters and emergency responses related to wildlife threats.
- **Flare Guns and Flares:** We carry flare guns and flares for signaling during emergencies or to deter wildlife from approaching our camp.

4. Emergency Evacuation Procedures:

- **Helicopter Support:** Oden provides essential helicopter support for medical evacuations or emergencies requiring swift transportation.
- **Evacuation Plan:** Our detailed evacuation plan includes designated landing zones for helicopters and predetermined emergency rendezvous points.
- **Communication with Oden:** We maintain constant communication with Oden to coordinate emergency responses and ensure effective evacuation procedures.

5. Emergency Response Team Assignments:

- **Roles and Responsibilities:** Each team member has designated roles such as first aid responders, communication coordinators, and safety officers to ensure a coordinated response in emergencies.
- **Emergency Drills:** Regular emergency drills are conducted to familiarize ourselves with procedures and protocols, enhancing our preparedness for potential emergencies.

6. Environmental and Weather Considerations:

- **Weather Monitoring:** We monitor weather conditions regularly and adjust our activities to mitigate risks associated with adverse weather.

7. Documentation and Reporting:

- **Incident Reporting:** We maintain a systematic approach to document and report all incidents, injuries, or emergencies promptly for thorough review and improvement of our emergency response capabilities.
