PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “GEOEO Expedition” project is located within the Qikiqtani region, approximately 500 kilometres (km) from Grise Fiord. The Proponent intends to conduct field research on evolutionary history of Arctic species and geological history of the High Arctic. The program is proposed to take place from August 1, 2024 to September 30, 2024. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of custom-built raft and Nesje coring system to gather lake sediment cores
- Gathering by hand of bones, teeth, and ancient plant material
- Use of icebreaker Oden as base of operations
- Use of helicopter to access sampling locations
