Aluminium boat	2	18' - 28'	One main filming boat with twin outboards will be used to locate camping equipment, and to film from each day. A second filming boat may be used on some days, and may be used to bring across supplies from Arctic Bay when needed (food and fuel re-supplies). All boats used will be hired from the local community and employ local skippers and first mates.

Propane	fuel	4	20	80	Lbs	We have a small camp of up to four people from outside Arctic Bay and then up to four guides from the local community. We will use enough cooking fuel (propane) to heat water and cook meals for them each day, plus a spare emergency gas canister in case of bad weather.
Gasoline	fuel	20	50	1000	Gallons	This will be the main fuel for the filming boats. These will be stored in secure, excellent condition fuel barrels. They will be stored on the edge of camp and used to refuel the filming boat daily/other-daily as required. We would like to store up to 20 of these.

We can either dig a temporary pit latrine into the land, or we can bring plastic bags to collect solid human waste and discard appropriately back in Arctic Bay. Avatiliriniqmut Ayurhauingit:

The temporary camp will be in place less than four weeks. The impact on the environment of us camping will be very little, we will ensure the area in which we camp is left in the same condition after we leave it.


