CIRNAC	Recommends the Proponent submit the Closure and Remediation Report with mapped extents of unauthorized sites, enhancing landfill controls, and improve segregation, storage and documentation of hazardous waste to prevent leachate migration.	A planning study to upgrade the existing solid waste facility is ongoing, which will provide recommendations on capital upgrades regarding fencing, signage, water diversion, segregation, and storage of hazardous wastes. The study will be complete towards the end of 2025. The Licensee requests that CIRNAC specify the authorized disposal sites referenced as per their comment.
CIRNAC	Recommends that the Proponent continue its efforts to consult with the Municipality of Sanikiluaq, and any other relevant organizations or individuals on its project proposal.	The Municipality of Sanikiluaq Council Motion approval of the new Water Treatment Plant will be provided in the Type A Water Licence application. The Government of Nunavut, Municipality of Sanikiluaq, and the General Contractor will be working together through the construction and operation phases of the new water treatment plant to ensure the use of local resources and to maximize training and employment of locals. The Municipality of Sanikiluaq staff will continue to operate and maintain the existing sewage disposal facility and solid waste disposal facility.
