RE: NPC File No. 150465 [Pelly Lake Remediation]

The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. Site cleanup & Remediation: Excavation and southern off-site disposal of all impacted sediments, hazardous debris and non-hazardous debris.
 - a. Temporary camp to be established summer 2025
2. Timing, Duration, & Personnel:
 - a. 210 days over period 1 July 2025 to 31 July 2026
 - i. Operations: 1 July to 30 September 2025
 - ii. Closure: 1 February to 31 July 2026

- b. 12 to 15 personnel for a total of 2520 to 3150 person-days
- 3. Location: Kivalliq Region; [Pelly Lake, approximately 300 km northwest of Baker Lake and 360 km southwest of Gjoa Haven]

The NPC has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plan. The project proposal requires screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) because it does not belong to a class of exempt works or activities set out in Schedule 12-1 of the *Nunavut Agreement*.
