PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Pelly Lake Remediation” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 250 kilometres (km) from Baker Lake. The Proponent intends to conduct site cleanup and remediation at the Pelly Lake site, a former airstrip and fuel cache site by Spartan Air Services. The program is proposed to take place from 2025 to 2026. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a temporary camp for 12-15 personnel
- Use of three (3) snowmobiles and sleds to transport personnel and waste
- Use of three (3) ATV and trailer to transport personnel and waste
- Use of a barrel crusher to crush drums
