## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Norwegian Tall Ship Through Northwest Passage and the Nunavut Region in 2025” project is located within the Kitikmeot and Qikiqtani regions, approximately in the communities of Pond Inlet, Gjoa Haven, and Cambridge Bay. The Proponent intends to conduct research about the ocean, share knowledge about the crucial role of the ocean, and identify the challenges that local Arctic people face as a result of the climate-driven changes. The program is proposed to take place from August to September 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Sail through the Northwest Passage on a tall ship
- Conduct interviews with some local communities
- Collect samples from the seafloor
- Collect information about the occurrence of marine mammals, the ocean current, weather patterns, ocean temperatures, and ocean light conditions
