## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “**Hanseatic Nature – Arctic Cruise 2025**” project is located within the Qikiqtani and Kivalliq regions, approximately 50 kilometres (km) from Iqaluit, Rankin Inlet and Chesterfield Inlet. The Proponent intends to conduct an expedition cruise to several landing sites in Nunavut starting from Sisimiut, Greenland and ending in Churchill, Manitoba with the aim to undertake tourism activities. A second cruise would start from Churchill and end in Sisimiut with the same stops in Nunavut.

The program is proposed to take place from July 31 to August 22, 2025. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Sail to Nunavut on the cruise ship *Hanseatic Nature* with a maximum of 230 passengers and 90 crew members;
- Use of up to ten (10) zodiacs to facilitate shore landings and excursions
- Use of fuel onboard for zodiacs; and
- Management and treatment of sewage, greywater, and non-combustible and combustible wastes on board the cruise vessel according to Canadian legislation
