The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. The proponent is planning to develop a community-scale solar array with a capacity of 4 MW DC (3 MW AC) and an accompanying battery storage system. This project aims to provide the community of Cambridge Bay, Nunavut, with clean and affordable renewable energy. The goal of the solar project is to reduce reliance on diesel generation, especially during the summer months, to the extent that the QEC diesel generators can be turned off for most of the summer. The project will be connected under QEC's Independent Power Producer program. This application pertains to the development of the lot that will house the solar and battery infrastructure for the project.
2. Location: Kitikmeot Region; [Cambridge Bay].

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plan.
