The board of the Taloyoak Umarulirigut Association (TUA) is writing to express our support for the Genome Canada project FISHES – Fostering Indigenous Small-scale fisheries for Health, Economy, and food Security, and application for a ‘License to Fish for Scientific Purposes’ (LFSP).


The goal of this project in our community is to 1) support the development of genomic-derived scientific tools used to foster sustainable management practices of commercial and subsistence fisheries, 2) support harvest biomonitoring, economic analyses and workshops that will help business development of commercial and subsistence fisheries options on the Boothia Peninsula close to Taloyoak, and 3) train local harvesters and youth on scientific sampling, economic analysis and mapping tools to document local and scientific knowledge. We fully support these objectives and see this project as a significant opportunity to advance our goal of developing our fishery resources while protecting our harvest areas for the benefit of our community.

We have been in ongoing communication with project leaders Stephan Schott and Jean-Sébastien Moore regarding the opportunities presented by this project. We are in full support of Arctic char fish stock sampling this year, as well as workshops on traditional Indigenous knowledge related to important fish stocks, country food processing, food security, and training sessions on scientific sampling. Additionally, we support the use of ATLAS tools to document local knowledge and facilitate knowledge exchange between researchers and the community. These sampling efforts and workshops will not only contribute to the advancement of commercial and subsistence fisheries in Taloyoak but will also support harvesters who collect these samples and help establish a baseline of fishery resources in our area. The locations identified in the license application were discussed with us and have been recognized as high-priority areas for the development of fisheries in our community. We appreciate the collaborative approach of this project and look forward to its positive impacts on our fisheries and overall food security.

We strongly encourage the approval of the License to Fish for Scientific Purposes for this project and look forward to working together to support sustainable fisheries development in Taloyoak.
