The expected route, depending on snow cover, crosses crown lands across the Agnico Eagle All Weather Private Road to access the Agnico Eagle Amaruk Camp. Materials to haul include drilling supplies, jet fuel, diesel fuel, heavy equipment, empty tanks, core boxes and general cargo See the attached map for all potential crown lands that may be crossed. The final trail location depends on the snow cover.

There will not be a camp set up - winter trail only for hauling supplies.

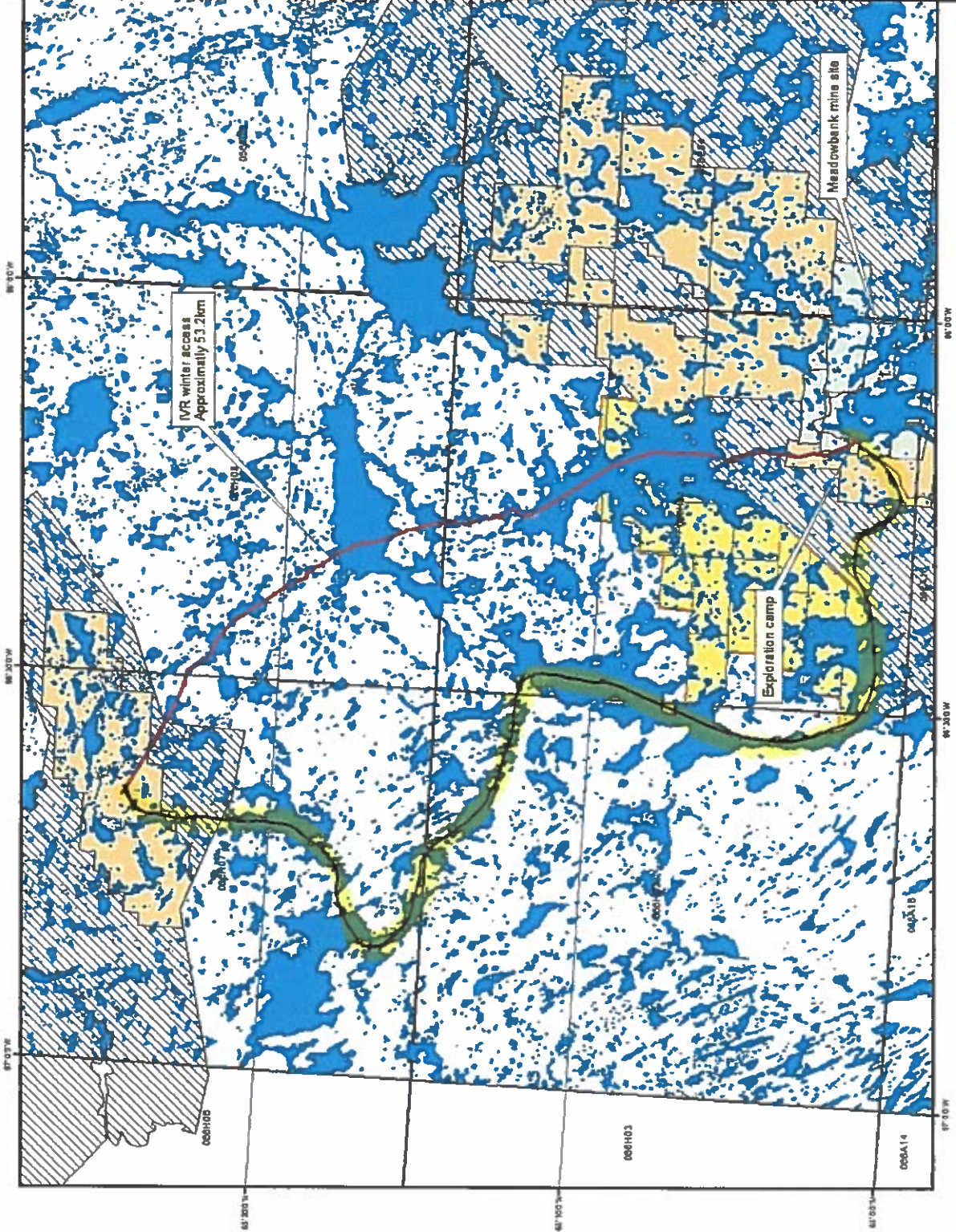

This application is for the use of crown lands for overland winter haul of supplies. The expected route, depending on snow cover, crosses crown lands across Siamese Lake to access the AREVA Kiggavik Camp. The route then crosses crown lands from the AREVA Kiggavik Camp to the Cameco Turqavik Camp on Aberdeen Lake. Materials to haul include drilling supplies, scrap materials, jet fuel, diesel fuel, equipment, empty tanks, core boxes, drill rods, and other miscellaneous camp supplies. See the attached map for all potential crown lands that may be crossed. The final trail location depends on the snow cover.

There will not be a camp set up - winter trail only for hauling supplies.

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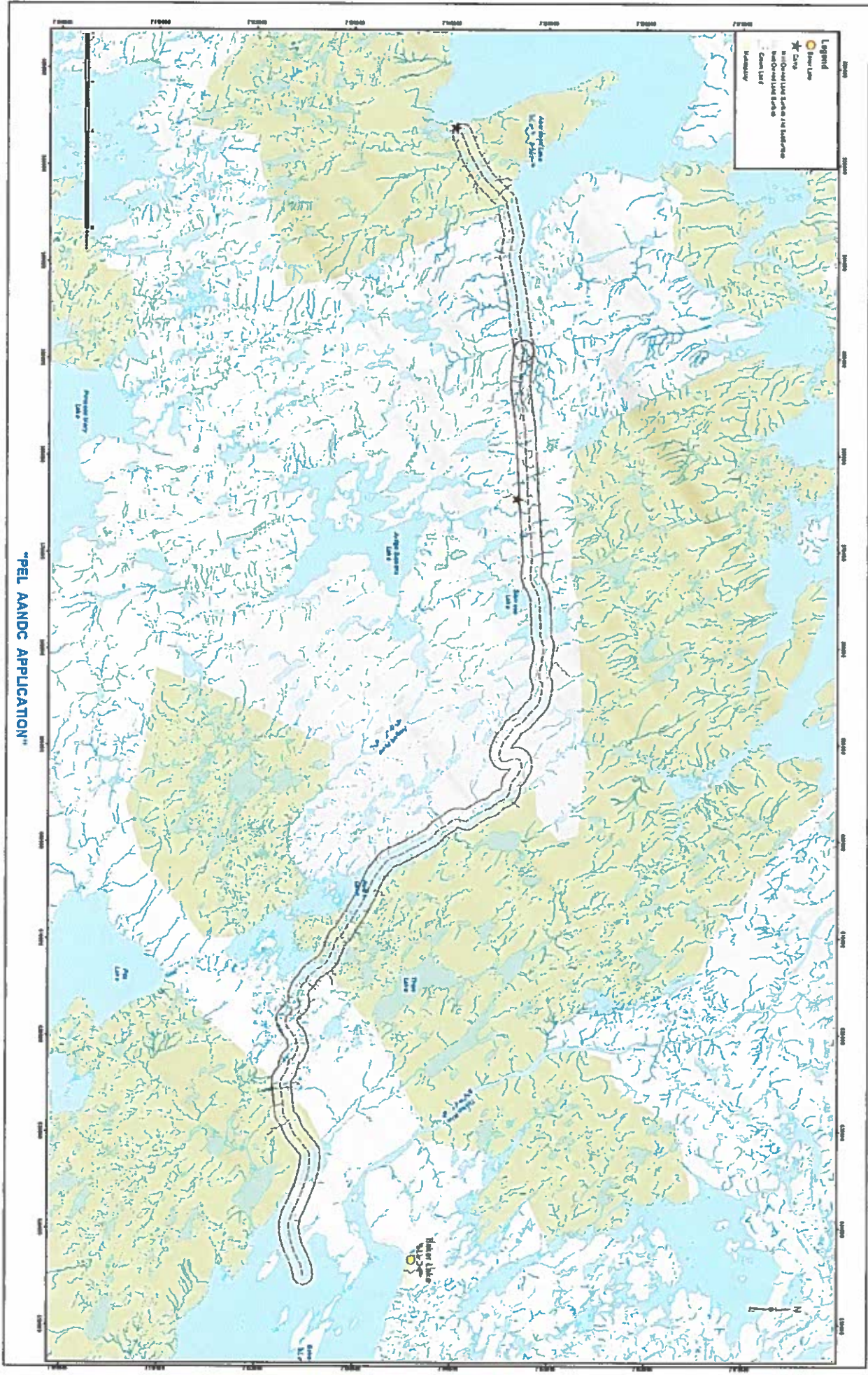
