PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Coppermine River Drilling Program” project is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 7km SW of Kugluktuk. The Proponent intends to conduct continue mineral exploration for copper and silver through geological, geophysical, and drilling programs, supported by the construction and operation of a temporary 50-person seasonal camp. The program is proposed to take place from March 2026 to October 2026. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use fixed-wing aircraft, helicopter, or all-terrain vehicle to move equipment and supplies to camp, and access drilling locations. Wildlife will be avoided, and aircrafts will not land in the presence of wildlife except in emergencies;
- Use of up to four (4) diamond drill rigs and up to two (2) reverse circulation (RC) drill rigs, with average drillhole depths of less than 400 m and total annual drilling not exceeding approximately 25,000 m. Exact drillhole locations will be determined and approved prior to ground disturbance;
- Transport, storage, and use of up to 10,250L of diesel fuel, 41,000L of jet fuel, 4,100L of gasoline, and 5,000lbs of propane. As well as up to 72L of motor oil, 1,800L of hydraulic oil, and 240L of anti-freeze coolants; and
- Greywater and drilling overburden contained in sumps and managed in accordance with approved waste and environmental management plans.

- a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and can be prevented/managed appropriately with known technology.

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
