

Potential long-term adverse irreversible cumulative effects are possible from increased stress to caribou and impacts to caribou habitat. There does not appear to be an effective framework for the identification and assessment of cumulative impacts to caribou that could result from the impacts of the proposed activities combined with those of any other project that has been carried out, is being carried out or is likely to be carried out within the Beverly/Qamanirjuaq herds' range in Nunavut.

Ghotelnene K'odtineh Dene highlight the need for greater assessment of the cumulative impacts to wildlife and wildlife habitat, particularly caribou, from projects within the Beverly/Qamanirjuaq herds' range in Nunavut. As noted above, caribou are critical to our well-being, way of life and the exercise of our rights.
