Thank you for the time to review my prospecting project Cache Zone 2026. It is my pleasure to inform your department of the concerns given within the commenting period ending March 31, 2026, on the NIRB website.

My apologies for not inserting the usual Mobile Protection Measures listed within the KIA Land Use License. Section 2 of the guideline will be adhered to protect, monitor and report any animals during this project. As this project is 2 man project my helper will be helping to mitigate and monitor for wildlife including bear monitoring. For any caribou within the area seen with one collar or a number of 25 caribou or more. A buffer zone of 30 km will be in effect where we monitor every second day to continue number of caribou(s) seen. If more continues a buffer zone of 5 km will be in effect to monitor daily. Drilling to suspend until caribou has past within sight and location.

A copy of the photo map where camp and fuel to be store on the shores of Quartzite Lake. Noting that per the location of the fuel of one drum (205L) is selected per the requirements of Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan and within the KIA Land Use License to be stored past 30 meters away from any body of water. There will be no facility as this is a two-person project. Just a camp, generator, food and Shaw Backpack Drill. There is enormous amount of old drums within this location approximately 0.37 miles west of the fuel (205L) drum. We can use one of them as storage for any contaminant spill. Also noting that I now have Certificate of Spill Response Course taken two weeks ago and attached to this letter. Since I have this certificate I will be designated to take action on any incidents. Shovels, materials and containing if possible but if not to contact 24 hour line. All Reporting Regulations stated within GN Spill Requirements will be in effect during this project and to remove the drum of fuel when travel by snow is ready the following year.
