The planned activities under the project are expected to result in little to no significant environmental or socio-economic impacts, given their temporary nature, execution during winter, and location in a remote area away from communities. Identified impacts are generally considered negligible or mitigable, and no unmitigable negative impacts are anticipated. As activities will take place along a temporary corridor without permanent infrastructure, potential disturbances to soil, snow, and the natural environment are expected to be limited and short-lived. From a socio-economic and human health perspective, no impacts are expected. The project takes place in the interior of Baffin Island, between Clyde River and Pangnirtung, away from inhabited areas. Activities are not expected to significantly interfere with traditional land uses, such as hunting or seasonal travel. No direct negative effects on the physical, social, psychological, or cultural well-being of communities are anticipated. Given the local and temporary nature of the project, no transboundary effects are expected. Regarding protected species, no direct interaction with species listed under the Species at Risk Act, their critical habitats, or residences is anticipated. Activities will occur during the polar winter, a period when biological activity is generally reduced in the region. Nevertheless, precautionary measures will be implemented to avoid disturbance to wildlife if any is observed near operations. Planned mitigation measures include scheduling activities during winter, using temporary travel corridors over frozen and snow-covered ground, and avoiding sensitive areas if identified on-site. Visual monitoring of wildlife and environmental conditions will be maintained during activities to ensure that any unforeseen interactions are managed promptly and that impacts remain minimal and temporary.

Cumulative Effects

Given the temporary and small-scale nature of the project in the interior of Baffin Island, between Clyde River and Pangnirtung, no significant cumulative impact with past, present, or reasonably foreseeable activities in the area is anticipated.
