The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. **Primary Land Use:** Scientific research

2. **Project summary description:** Namminiqsurniq Professional Project Administrator Program in partnership with Royal Roads University is offering a full-time six-month program to Nunavut Inuit to support devolution related employment. Through land-based learning, scientific measurement, and Inuit knowledge, learners will explore terrestrial freshwater and marine ecosystems surrounding the Iqaluit region. Most of the course will be field based where learners will perform water quality assessments, vegetation sampling, snow and ice measurements, wildlife observation and harvest monitoring, and oceanographic data collection.
3. **Location:** Qikiqtani Region; [Iqaluit and surrounding areas, Frobisher Bay, Sylvia Grinnell Territorial Park, and Katannilik Territorial Park]

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plan.
