

2011 Planned Work:

The 2011 work program will be a continuation mineral exploration on the Commander Resources Ltd. mineral tenure holdings on Baffin Island. This exploration for gold and base metal has been ongoing since 2004. The property includes mineral claims under the jurisdiction of Indian and Northern Affairs and three agreement areas of KTI. Fieldwork will include regional and property-scale prospecting, sampling, mapping and local ground geophysical surveying.

The existing Dewar Lakes Camp at 68° 37'59" N, 71° 06'38" W, adjacent to the Dewar Air Strip will be used for all property work.

Fixed-wing aircraft will transport personnel and supplies to the camps. A helicopter based in-camp will be used on a daily basis for crew setouts and pickups.

All work will be conducted in accordance with the Commander Resources Ltd. operational plans as outlined in the company's Health & Safety Manual, Fuel Spill Contingency Plan and Final Abandonment and Restoration Plan. Excess materials, empty drums, diamond drills and other extraneous materials will be back-hauled to Iqaluit. Consideration will be given to removal of all materials at the Malrok Lake camp (68° 30'06" N, 072°27'08" W).

Wildlife:

Wildlife sightings were sporadic and very limited during the 2010 field program. None appeared to be stressed by the human presence or exploration activities. Documentaion of wildlife and bird encounters are summarized in the tables below.
