After further investigation into Land Use Permit #N2007X0043, it has been concluded that no action was taken with respect to the construction and utilization of the permitted winter trail between Kughuktuk and McGregor Lake.

Records show that an alternate route was requested by the KIA shortly after the approval of the initial Permit. The Amendment to this Permit occurred on or after May 2, 2008. As such, there was not sufficient time remaining within the winter season to commence the winter trail.

Given the nature of the matter, no technical report can be provided with respect to the permit. 5050 Nunavut Limited acknowledges that much time and money from various government agencies and industry consultants was spent on the original Permit and Permit Amendment. Given that no work was carried out and assuming there is no material change to the document, the Company wishes to inquire if Land Use Permit #N2007X0043 can be renewed with the intent to exercise the Permit in the winter of 2010-2011.
