The Permittee is authorized to:

- **Enter Polar Bear Pass NWA to conduct a survey of shorebirds via aerial and ground surveys.**
- **To float shorebird eggs in water to determine its laying and hatch date.**

Permit Conditions:

1. This permit is not valid unless signed by the permittee (holder) or authorized representative, in the space designated as "signature of holder".
2. All personnel and activities carried out under the authority or on behalf of the permittee fall under the conditions of this permit.
3. **Conditions set by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB Review 08YN017) are considered to be a part of the conditions of this permit.**
4. Regardless of the expiry date of the permit, the permittee will be responsible for the activity necessary and the cost of that activity for the clean up or restoration of habitat as deemed necessary by Environment Canada.
5. The permittee or his/her delegate must carry a copy of this permit with them at all times. He/she must also ensure that all persons engaged in the activity understand and abide by permit conditions.
6. The permittee is responsible for obtaining whatever other permits are necessary to undertake the activity, and must obtain them prior to beginning the activity.
7. Issuance of this permit does not exempt the permittee from other relevant Canadian laws and regulations.
8. Additional restrictions may be imposed by an Environment Canada Enforcement Officer if that Officer deems it necessary.
9. The activity must be undertaken in such a way as to minimize disturbance to wildlife and wildlife habitat.
10. Areas with concentrations of birds should be avoided much as possible outside of research activities.
11. At no time shall persons under this permit feed wildlife, or attempt to attract wildlife into an area of human activity.
12. The presence of a wild animal that may potentially create a hazard to people or property shall be reported immediately to the nearest Renewable Resources Officer or RCMP officer.
13. Firearms shall only be used for the purposes of protection from wildlife.
14. Garbage and debris must be removed from the National Wildlife Area and any activity that occurs during the permitted activity.
