On December 2, 2014 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) invited parties to comment on the potential exemption under Section 12.4.3 of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement for Carleton University with the Canadian Wildlife Service's "Community-Based Monitoring of Sea Ice and Eider Duck Populations around the Belcher Islands, Nunavut" project proposal. Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) appreciates the opportunity to provide comments, and, following a review within our mandate, offers the responses below as it pertains to the NIRB's request:

Whether the inclusion of the additionally proposed component(s) and/or activity(ies) would significantly modify the project;

The additionally proposed components and activities do not seem to significantly modify the project scope nor are they likely to introduce significant impacts.
