**Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Natural Resources Canada's "Natural Hazards in Baffin Bay" project proposal**

Dear Robbie Bennett:

On May 24, 2013 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Natural Resources Canada's (NRCan) "Natural Hazards in Baffin Bay" project proposal from Nunavut Research Institute (NRI). On May 31, 2013 the NIRB received a positive conformity determination (North Baffin Regional Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC). The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number 13YN021.

The proposed project would be located in Baffin Bay (and Boas Fiord if time permits) and would be looking at conducting a number of different surveys utilizing the Canadian Coast Guard vessel the Hudson. The research is a collaboration between the Geological Survey of Canada, Fisheries and Oceans Canada and various universities. The major research goals of the expedition would be to:

1. Investigate earthquake activity in Baffin Bay;
2. Investigate how stable the seabed is in Baffin Bay;
3. Investigate natural leakage of buried oil and gas deposits at the seabed;
4. Understand how the seabed is being changed by ocean currents and by icebergs that drag along the bottom; and,
5. Look for the presence of unique seabed habitats that may be important for fish

The program is proposed to take place from August 14 to September 17, 2013.

The project activities include:

- Sailing the CCGS Hudson from Halifax to the study area and back for crew quarters;
  - Crew change may happen at Iqaluit
  - Fuel would be stored on board the ship
  - Water would be obtained through desalinization

- Wastes would be stored onboard until return to Halifax
- Usage of various equipment to conduct the surveys, including:
  - Piston Sediment Corerer – to collect sediment samples for analysis
  - Seabed camera system – photography and video of seabed
  - CTD and Niskin water sampler – collect water samples for analysis
  - 3.5 kHz echosounder – seabed imaging
  - Multibeam echosounder – detailed bathymetry data collection

The NIRB may request additional information at any time during the process. The NIRB will copy you on screening process related correspondence and upload related documents to the above ftp site for public access.

The NIRB is copying parties and municipalities potentially affected by NRCan's project proposal with this letter, and we invite interested parties to comment directly to the NIRB by **June 27, 2013**.

The NIRB would like parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
