PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Arctic Carbonates, Sandstones and Volcanic Rocks – North Axel Heiberg Island, Nunavut” project is located within the Qikiqtani region (North Baffin), on Axel Heiberg Island, approximately 650 kilometres (km) north of Resolute Bay, and 500 km northeast of Grise Fiord. The proponent intends to investigate and collect carbonate, sandstone, and volcanic rock samples for geochemical and microscopic analysis. The program is proposed to take place in July of 2016:

- Investigation of carbonate, sandstone and volcanic outcrops
- Collection of 50 0.5-kilogram rock samples
- Transportation of up to three (3) personnel
- Establishment of three (3) temporary camps

Parties are also invited to recommend any specific mitigation measures they feel would be appropriate, and to bring any other matter of importance related to this project proposal to the NIRB’s attention.
