## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Meadowbank Precious Metal” project is located within the Kivalliq region, approximately 100 kilometres (km) northeast from the community of Baker Lake. The Proponent intends to conduct an early stage exploration program to delineate targets for diamond drilling, and explore for economic gold deposits in three (3) locations along the existing Meadowbank Road. The program is proposed to take place from June to August, 2017. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Establishment of six (6) to ten (10) temporary exploration camps
- Use of diamond drill for core rock samples
- Conduct prospecting, till sampling and ground geophysical surveys
- Use of existing Meadowbank Road
