Defence Construction Canada on behalf of the Department of National Defence is providing the following annual report, which summarizes the activities in 2016 and outlines the planned activities for 2017.

Summary of 2016 Activities

1. Production of ~ 3700 cu.m of armour stone (details in Annex A, NNF – 2016 Annual Quarry Report);
2. Progressive reclamation throughout the quarrying operation;
3. Naval Facility Site Access roads upgrades and maintenance;
4. Construction camp operation and maintenance activities;
5. Naval Distillate infrastructure – facility containment, liner, and foundation;
6. Diesel tanks, POL Storage Area and containment infrastructure;
7. Operational Area infrastructure;
8. Pipe rack infrastructure;
9. Wharf;
 - a. Sheet pile work
 - b. cathodic protection installation
10. General Use Warehouse installation (foundation & structure);
11. Electrical House modular installation (prefabricated);
12. Wharf Operator Shelter installation (prefabricated);
13. Upgrades to the existing DND site office;

Local Hires – 22 individuals for a total of 7585 hours

The construction contractor offered on the job training (Inuit workers were paired with an experienced worker and closely supervised), and tool box meetings for specific site procedures training.

Work Plan for 2017

The proposed work plan for the 2017 season includes:

1. Naval Facility Site Access roads upgrades and maintenance;
2. Construction camp operation and maintenance activities;

3. Naval Distillate infrastructure – facility containment, liner, and foundation
4. Diesel tanks, POL Storage Area and containment infrastructure
5. Operational Area infrastructure
6. Wharf upgrades
7. Foundation for the Spanwire System

Compliance with NIRB Terms and Conditions

The NNF project has endeavoured to comply with all terms and conditions required by authorizing bodies and applicable Acts, Regulations and Guidelines.

- All camp fuel was stored using adequate secondary containment located more than 30 m from any water body. Appropriate spill response equipment was readily available, and fuel was routinely inspected by properly trained personnel.
- No damage to wildlife habitat or harassment of wildlife occurred. All project personnel were trained in wildlife protective measures. There has been no disturbance or destruction to nests or eggs of any birds. There has been no disturbance to Caribou and muskox. (See Annex B - Wildlife Log)
- All aircraft flight restrictions have been adhered to.
- During aggregate production dust suppression methods were utilized, and no sediment was deposited into any water body.
- The construction camp was erected on a prepared gravel pad, and there is no camp, equipment or material stored on the surface of lakes or streams.
- At the conclusion of the 2016 field season all garbage was removed from site.
- The project activities did not interfere with Inuit wildlife harvesting or traditional land use activities.
- A comprehensive description of Community Consultations cannot be provided at this time; the scheduled Community Consultations will occur 11 April 2017, a description of this meeting will be provided in the 2017 Annual Report.



OVERVIEW

This document refers to the conditions annexed to the Land Use Permit N2014Q0024 issued December 1st 2014 by Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada, for the purpose of the Nanisivik Naval Facilities project. These annexed conditions define the responsibilities and the obligations of the permittee associated with quarrying activities. Among these conditions, the Section 31 (1) (b) – 8 sets the requirements for producing an annual report, as follow:

"The Permittee shall submit an annual report to the Engineer by March 30th of each year of permitted activities. The annual report must contain, but not limited to, the following information:

- a) A summary of activities undertaken for the year including*
- b) A map showing the following items with exact coordinates (Degrees/min/sec, in NAD 83):*
 - i. All camp locations*
 - ii. Air strip and landing location*
 - iii. All drilling locations*
 - iv. All fuel caches*
 - v. Any other location where activities were conducted*
- c) A work plan for the following year, including any progressive reclamation work undertaken. "*


The intent of this report is to provide a description of quarrying activities undertaken in 2016, to reflect the current site organisation and the planned operations for 2017 construction season.

ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN IN 2016

The activities undertaken at the Nanisivik quarry in 2016 are summarised as follows:

- Production of ~ 3700 cu.m of armour stone (July 14th to September 2nd)

A total of 15 blasts were conducted in 2016 at the Nanisivik quarry for the production of armour stone. Blasting operations were followed by sorting the rock by size, hauling the selected material to the construction site where a 3399 cu.m stockpile of armour stone was built at South-East corner. An estimated volume of 300 cu.m of armour stone was used for the completion of shoreline protection works.

- **Progressive reclamation** (Throughout the quarrying operation)

The excess blasted material was used to dress the exposed face of the quarry in a manner to obtain a minimum of 2:1 slopes and a maximum of 10m exposed quarry face. Throughout the operation, debris and waste materials were removed from the working area and disposed of. Due to weather conditions prevailing in early September, the completion of the quarry reclamation was delayed to 2017.

- **Demobilization of drilling equipment and explosive contrainers** (September 3rd to September 5th)

Following the end of blasting operations, the drill was demobilised from the quarry with the two remaining explosive warehouses. There is currently no drilling or crushing equipment left at the quarry or the construction site, except the primary screener (scalper) left for the 2017 sand washing operation.

- The map doesn't show any fuel storage area since the fuel is transported from Arctic Bay to the construction site with a fuel truck.

WORK PLAN FOR 2017 PHASE

The activities planned for 2017 can be summarised as follow:


- Quarry final reclamation: (5-7 days)

The remaining quarry reclamation shall be undertaken as per conditions prevailing in the land use permit and as per quarry management plan. This will include but not limited to:

- Dress the slopes with non-used blasted material
- Leave the exposed faces of the quarry to a 10m maximum height. Ensure that the faces are stable
- Clean the quarry area from debris produced such as explosives bags, but also items such as drilling bits.
- Perform a final site grading to prevent water from ponding, surface erosion and siltation
- Leave the worked areas of the quarry in a neat and tidy condition

A volumetric estimate for the quantity of bulk material (non-used blasted rock) remaining at the quarry will be provided.

Wildlife

All staff arriving at the site for any phase of the Project will receive orientation on Wildlife Mitigation and Monitoring Plan. The orientation will include educating workers on wildlife that can be anticipated at the site (mammals, birds, marine mammals), measures they are responsible for upholding, reporting and general practices enforced to limit disturbance to nearby wildlife and maintain health and safety of workers.

It is forbidden to feed, approach, or harass wild animals, including animals moving through work zones or campsites. It is also forbidden to store food outside the camp and to throw away food outside.

Feeding wild animals will decrease the animals desire to hunt for itself and its young, impacting their and future generations' ability to survive. Harassing wild animals could interrupt life cycles, impacting future development of the wild animal populations.

Recyclable material will be separated from other waste, compacted and stored for off-site transport. Solid waste suitable for incineration will be incinerated on-site on a daily basis.

Flights to and from the helicopter landing area are not expected for the project, but if need be, they will follow an established flight corridor to reduce disruption to nearby wildlife and avoid known wildlife movement corridors.

It is also forbidden to hunt or trap.

In the event that wildlife is present in the vicinity, work will cease until the wildlife has moved out of the immediate area. Workers should seek out a safe location and distance themselves from the animal(s) if safe to do so. At no time shall any worker attempt to scare away the wildlife, but shall let it leave the vicinity on its own.

Every encounter has to be reported to the General Contractor and kept in a logbook.

Polar Bears

There will be a wildlife monitor permanently on the worksite. Two Inuit recruited in the community of Arctic Bay will assume this role. They will have their Wildlife monitor's license/course. Wildlife monitors will patrol the camp zone, work zones and career zone in a 4 x 4 side by side type vehicle. They will also be provided with a firearm. In case of intrusion of a polar bear near the work zone, the wildlife monitor will apply the appropriate measures to scare or keep away the polar bear from the site. If an animal had to be shot down, the Wildlife monitor will report the facts to the General Contractor, who will contact the local authorities to indicate the place and time of the event. Weapons are stored at the camp in a cabinet designed for this purpose and will be locked at all times.
