The Arctic Ocean is part of the Scheduled waters listed under the Navigation Protection Act (NPA) and any works within the Arctic Ocean will require a NPA approval prior to action. Fisheries and Oceans Canada must submit a notice of works to the Transport Canada Prairie and Northern Region office for the Kitikmeot Region Marine Science Study. Please indicate when the study is scheduled to take place as well as any temporary works and construction methodology that may be required.

Transport Canada also recommends Fisheries and Oceans Canada review the amendments to the Minor Works and Waters Order and self-assess to determine if any of the proposed in-water works may be considered a Minor Work. Minor works under the Order do not require notice or approval by TC.
