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

<b>Term and Condition No.</b>	xxx

<b>Responsible Parties:</b>	Who is responsible for meeting the term and condition
<b>Project Phase:</b>	Construction, Operations, Temporary Closure /Care and Maintenance, Closure and Post-Closure Monitoring
<b>Objective:</b>	Provides a short description of the impact or effect being mitigated. Where relevant, expectations regarding the timing for when terms and conditions will be deemed to be satisfied (i.e. sunset clause), who has discretion for determining it is satisfied has been provided.
<b>Term or Condition:</b>	From Final Hearing Report
<b>Reporting Requirements:</b>	To be coordinated with other licensing processes to the extent possible.
