


COMMENT FORM FOR NIRB SCREENINGS

<p>The proposal has been reviewed to determine whether it is likely to result in serious harm to fish which is prohibited under subsection 35(1) of the <i>Fisheries Act</i> unless authorized. The proposal has also been reviewed to determine whether it is likely to affect listed aquatic species at risk, any part of their critical habitat or the residences of their individuals in a manner which is prohibited under sections 32, 33 and subsection 58(1) of the <i>Species at Risk Act</i>, unless authorized. Provided that the plans are implemented in the manner, and during the timeframe, described, the Program has determined that the proposal will not result in serious harm to fish or prohibited effects on listed aquatic species at risk. As such, an authorization under the <i>Fisheries Act</i> or a permit under the <i>Species at Risk Act</i> is not required.</p>
