PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Mel Project” project which would be located in the same area as previously approved and would be located within the Qikiqtani (South Baffin) region and the area of jurisdiction of the KRULP, approximately 150 kilometres (km) south from Hall Beach and 200 km northeast from Nauyasat. The Proponent intends to amend the scope of previously approved activities to include an incinerator and extend the period of operation for the project activities. The program is proposed to take place from 2019 to 2024. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Addition of a waste incinerator; and
- Continue to use existing temporary camp to facilitate mineral exploration activities.
