## PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “ESHL Sports Hunts” project is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 200 kilometres (km) south from Cambridge Bay within the Queen Maud Gulf Bird Sanctuary. The Proponent intends to conduct multi-year guided sports hunts during the spring, summer and fall seasons to educate sport hunters and adventure tourists in traditional hunting practices and Inuit culture. The program is proposed to take place between March 2019 to October 2022. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Transport groups of four (4) tourists (maximum of 12 in spring and 15 in fall) and guides from Cambridge Bay to Ellis River
- Use of an existing permanent camp at Ellis River
- Storage and use of 225 gallons of fuel for motor vehicles and heat for the camp
- Hiring of qualified local Inuit guides
