PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “Nunavut Clean Energy Project: Rankin Inlet and Baker Lake” project is located within the municipal boundaries of Rankin Inlet and Baker Lake in the Kivalliq region. The Proponent intends to construct and operate two 900 kW wind turbines (~60m in height) in each community. The program is proposed to take place from 2021 to 2041. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Construction and operation of MET Mast towers in Baker Lake and Rankin Inlet;
- Drilling and blasting of bedrock for foundation and anchor placement for towers
- Installation of new transforming station within existing lease site
- Ongoing operation and maintenance of wind towers and turbines
