

Community Engagement:


The "Community Involvement & Regional Benefits" of the submitted application form does not contain any information. It is understood that the proponent will conduct research in study sites within 400 km of Iqaluit. Nearby communities include Iqaluit, Kimmirut, Cape Dorset, and Pangnirtung.

CIRNAC recommends that the proponent contact the municipalities of Iqaluit, Kimmirut, Cape Dorset, and Pangnirtung; the Qikiqtani Inuit Association; and Nunavut Arctic College to develop a suitable community engagement strategy. As a minimum, this strategy should provide opportunities for local residents to become informed of the project proposal; contribute Inuit knowledge and/or Inuit Qaujimaningit to the project design; and be briefed on monitoring results.



CIRNAC appreciates the opportunity to provide comments and looks forward to working with the NIRB and the Proponent, as necessary, throughout any further review related to this project.
