**RE: NPC File # 149131 [Naujaat Community Access Trail]**

The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. Upgrade 15 km of existing ATV tracks to community access trail within municipal boundaries
2. Modification: inclusion of culverts, borrow pits, and bridges to project description
3. Related NPC FILE No: 148988; Related NIRB FILE No. 19PN003
4. Location: Kivalliq Region; [Outside Naujaat]

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) previously reviewed works and activities associated with the current proposal, including the access road (conformity determination issued Jan. 14 2019) and forwarded the proposal to the Nunavut Impact Review Board for screening (NIRB FILE NO.: 19PN003). This conformity determination still applies. On April 9, 2019, the NPC received a notice of inclusion to scope from the NIRB identifying “additional works or activities as being sufficiently related to the project to form part of it” and on April 11, 2019 the NPC advised the proponent to submit a modified proposal describing the additional activities. The NPC has completed its review of the above noted project proposal.

The NPC has determined that the above-noted project proposal is a significant modification to the project. It conforms to the Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan (KRLUP). The proponent has undertaken to comply with the applicable conformity requirements of Appendix C, G, and H of the KRLUP.

The above-noted project proposal requires screening by the NIRB under section 12.4.3 of the Nunavut Agreement as amended because it is for a component or activity that was not part of the original proposal and its inclusion is a significant modification of the project. By way of this letter, the NPC is forwarding the project proposal with this

determination to the NIRB for screening. Project materials, including the applicable conformity requirements, are available at the following address:

The regulatory authorities to which this letter is addressed are responsible under the Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act (NUPPAA) to implement any of the applicable requirements by incorporating the requirements directly, or otherwise ensuring that they must be met, in the terms and conditions of any authorizations issued.

This conformity determination applies only to the above noted project proposal as submitted. Proponents may not carry out projects and regulatory authorities may not issue licenses, permits and other authorizations in respect of projects if a review by the NPC is required. Regulatory authorities may consult with the NPC to obtain recommendations on their duties to implement the existing land use plans prior to issuing licenses, permits and other authorizations under subsection 69(6) of the NUPPAA.
