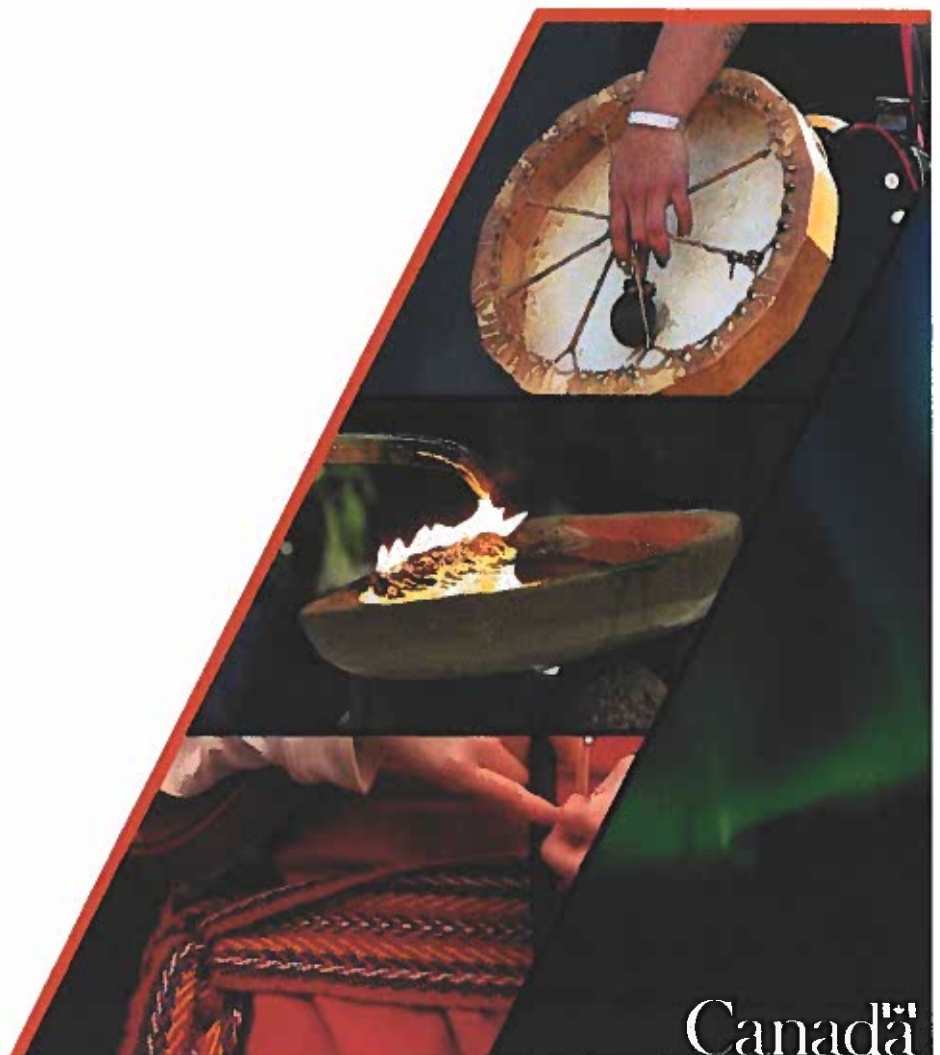

On April 12, 2019, the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) invited parties to comment on University of Rhode Island's "URI Northwest Passage Project 2019" project proposal. Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada (CIRNAC) reviewed the project proposal and related documents and offers the responses below as it pertains to the NIRB's request:

Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why:

It is understood that the proponent will be conducting shore landings in the communities of Pond Inlet and Resolute Bay as well as other historic/cultural sites. CIRNAC recommends that project-specific term and condition (No. 15) from the University of Rhode Island's "URI Northwest Passage Project 2018" Screening Decision Report dated July 13, 2018 is reasonable and should be included in the Screening Decision Report for the 2019 project if the project proceeds.

Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal:


CIRNAC is aware the NIRB views the University of Rhode Island's "URI Northwest Passage Project 2019" project proposal as an amendment to the previously screened "URI Northwest Passage Project 2018". CIRNAC has reviewed the proposed project-specific terms and conditions in the Notice of Screening and Comment Request Letter: Appendix B, which are to be included in the Screening Decision Report for the 2019 project if the project proceeds.
