<p><b>Do you have any suggestions or recommendations for this application?</b></p> <p>The watercourses currently identified are not on the List of Scheduled Waters under the <i>Navigation Protection Act</i>, therefore no approvals will likely be issued under the Navigation Protection Program (NPP). If the proponent chooses to "opt-in" for works in non-scheduled navigable waters, they can submit a request to the NPP to have their project assessed and reviewed for navigability.</p> <p>If equipment is required to be barged to the community, the proponent must adhere to the <i>Canada Shipping Act, 2001</i> (CSA). The CSA provides an overall regime to protect the safety and the environment for vessels operating in waters under Canadian jurisdiction. Its regulations include requirements for a vessel's construction, management of ballast water, pollution control, arrangements for emergency response, and crew qualifications. Pollution response and prevention measures apply in respect of vessels in Canadian waters or waters in the exclusive economic zone of Canada.</p>
